# Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration: Kipling Avenue Access to Viking Lane / Albans Ramp W Reconstruction


#### Contract: 16ECS-TI-01SP Start Date: September 28, 2018 Expected End Date: December 2018 \*Timeline is subject to change\*

The City of Toronto continues reconstructing the Six Points Interchange. Work is taking place southeast of Bloor Street West and Kipling Avenue (former Westwood Theatre lands), and at locations along Bloor Street West, Kipling Avenue, Dundas Street West, and Kipling access ramps (see map below).

This project is part of the Council-approved 2016 - 2025 Capital Budget and Plan, and supports the development of Etobicoke Centre as a vibrant mixed-use transit-oriented community. Additional Notices will be distributed as construction progresses.

## **Ongoing Construction**

Construction described in previous notification continues in the grey **Work Zone Locations** shown on the **Work Area** map:

- Constructing the new Dundas Street West alignment and Roads A & B
- Regrading Kipling Avenue. One lane of traffic in each direction is maintained.
- Reconstruction of Bloor Street <u>south side</u>. One lane of traffic in each direction maintained.
- Widening and reconstruction of Dunbloor Road. Full Closure to vehicles October 1 December, 2018.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<b>Work Hours</b> : Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, subject to safe weather conditions, with work after hours and on weekends as required and approved by the City.
÷	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Adequate signage will be placed in advance of any sidewalk restrictions. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	<b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
8	<b>Traffic Management</b> : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets.

®	<b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. Please contact parking control for the location of your vehicle at <b>416-808-2222</b> .
	<b>Transit Service:</b> This project will affect travel times of a number of TTC and MiWay Routes to and from Kipling Subway Station that travel along Bloor Street West and Kipling Avenue.
