Road Construction on Disco Road, Carlingview Drive and Attwell Drive

Contract: 18ECS-TI-104LR
Expected Start Date: September 4, 2018
Expected End Date: December 31, 2018



The City of Toronto will reconstruct Disco Road from Carlingview Drive to Attwell Drive and resurface the road on Disco Road from Attwell Drive to the southbound underpass of Highway 427; the City is planning to reconstruct the road on Attwell Drive from Disco Rd to 504m East of Carlingview Dr (see map).

The work includes replacing both sides of the curb and gutter on Disco Road and Attwell Drive, the concrete sidewalk will be installed and/or replaced where required along Disco Road, Attwell Drive, and Carlingview Drive from Attwell Drive to 150m south of Attwell Drive.

This work is needed to bring the road to a state of good repair and improve storm water runoff. This project is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program to renew aging infrastructure.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Excavate the existing roadway within reconstruction limits and replace the concrete base, then place asphalt.
- Grind the existing asphalt surface within resurfacing areas and place new surface course asphalt.
- · Restore areas affected by construction



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WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You will experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard or front yard), such as landscaping, fencing, irrigation systems and /or decorative objects if they do not want them removed or damaged during construction. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property.
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Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.



Pre-Construction Inspection: Wristen's Home Specialties Inc. (WHS), under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access.

If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.



Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.

Disco Road - Traffic will be restricted to one lane in each direction.

Attwell Drive - Traffic will be restricted to one lane with flag-persons during active work hours. One lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained at other times.



Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at **416-808-2222.**

In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Field Ambassador does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.



TTC Service: This project may affect travel times on the 45B Kipling Avenue North bus. Visit ttc.ca for regular route schedule information.



Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them.

Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.



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Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).



Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
