Watermain Replacement on Martin Grove Road From Eglington Avenue West to Rathburn Road

Expected Start Date: Fall 2018 Expected End Date: Summer 2019

*Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto will be replacing nearly 2 km of the watermain and City-owned portion of substandard water services on Martin Grove Road between Eglinton Avenue West and 165 metres north of Rathburn Road starting this fall, with completion planned by the summer of 2019.

The water service is the underground pipe that brings water to your water meter and is owned by you and by the City. The part you own is from your house to the end of your property, the part the City owns is from the end of your property to the watermain.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2018 Capital Works Program to renew our aging infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk of watermain breaks.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD WATER SERVICES

If you live in a house or property on Martin Grove Road in the area described, that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Please read the attached fact sheet with important information about the risks of lead in drinking water, especially if someone in your house is pregnant, there are children under six years old, or there is an infant drinking formula made using tap water.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work
 includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where
 necessary.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as
 landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the
 boulevard, please contact the Project Manager listed below.

Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please read the attached fact sheet as it contains important information about lead in drinking water and water service replacement. **First, you need to find out if your water service is lead** – a licensed plumber can help you with this. If it is lead, the City of Toronto encourages you to replace it. We recommend you obtain several quotes and you can contact the City's contractor for one of your quotes. Approximately two weeks prior to construction, you will receive a "Construction Notice" with the name and phone number of the City contractor. Learn more at www.toronto.ca/leadpipes




Pre-Construction Inspection: The City-hired contractor may need access to your home to complete a pre-construction survey. Affected properties will receive a pre-construction survey request to schedule a time to complete the survey.



Accessible Accommodation: Properties who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the City to arrange for access during the construction period.
