On-Street Parking Restrictions on Summerhill Avenue due to Rosehill Reservoir Rehabilitation

The City's contractor requires approximately 40 metres of roadway on Summerhill Avenue in front of Little Park/Summerhill Entrance to deliver large equipment and supplies to the Valve House. This will restrict access to on-street parking on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. starting Monday October 29 to Friday December 21, 2018.

From <u>7 a.m. to 5 p.m.</u>, starting <u>October 29 to December 21</u>, 2018, there will be no access to on-street parking at the following locations: (map on reverse)

91 to 101 Summerhill Avenue

ON-STREET PARKING ENFORCEMENT: TICKETS & VEHICLE RELOCATION

Relocation: If a vehicle has not been moved by 7 a.m., Parking Enforcement may be required to relocate your vehicle. In the event that your vehicle is relocated please contact (416) 808-2222 to speak with directly with Parking Enforcement to obtain your vehicle's location.



Tickets: If you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the ticket. You can quote "Rosehill Reservoir" as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, **the Rosehill Reservoir Rehabilitation Project Manager does not have the authority to cancel any tickets**.

Please note: there will be no consideration for offences such as "Stopping on Sidewalks, Parking on Boulevards, Fire Hydrants, Fire Routes or Rush Hour Route restrictions".
