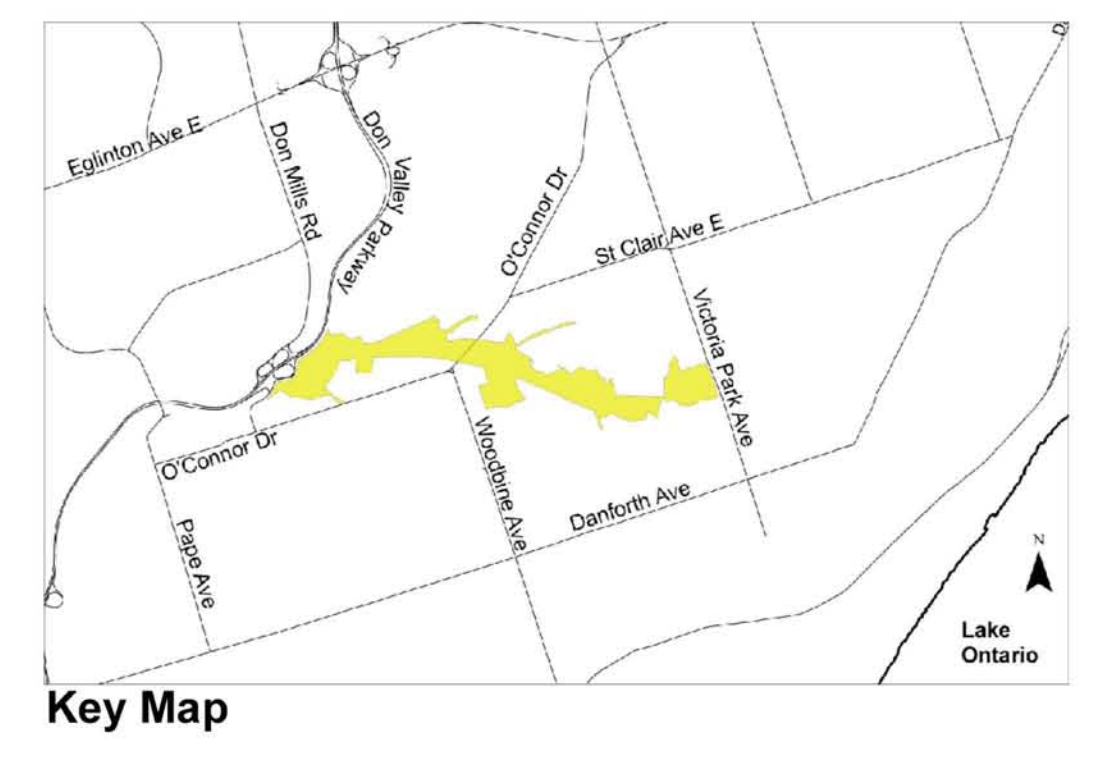

**Improvements Require Conceptual Design Development*

Park-Wide Trail Recommendations

1. Address informal trail creation, use and safety. Close where environmental impacts or safety concerns outweigh benefits of recreational use.
2. Assess and standardize the design of all formal and informal access points to maximize safety, accessibility, aesthetics and information to users.
3. Improve safety and circulation on multi-use trails by addressing flooding, winter icing conditions and maintenance.
4. Develop signage strategy in cooperation with Parks and Trails Wayfinding Strategy. Include: wayfinding, regulatory signage and interpretive signage (cultural and educational)
5. Assess parking needs and consider improvements to lot designs if required.
6. Ensure current and future potential permitted uses do not negatively impact sensitive environmental features and functions.
