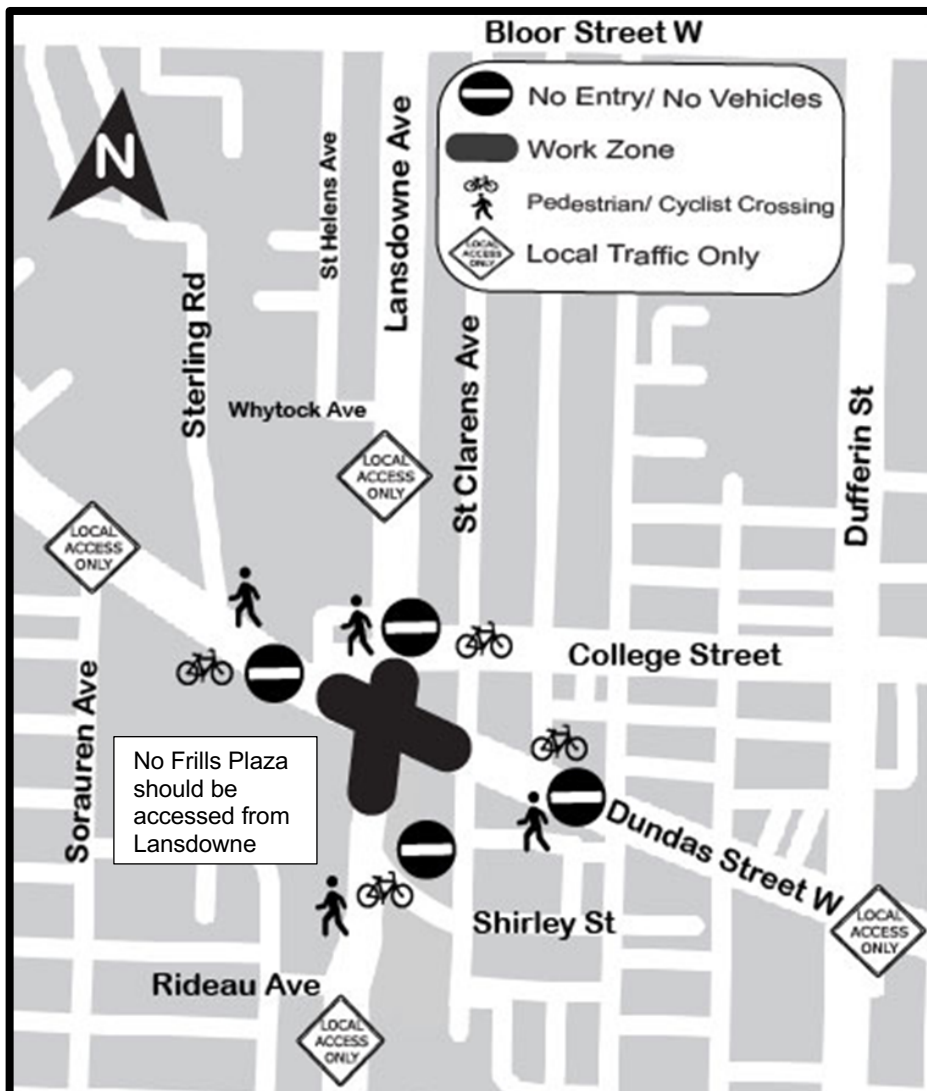
The City of Toronto and Toronto Transit Commission's work to renew aging streetcar tracks at the intersection of Dundas Street West and Lansdowne Avenue is nearly complete. By October 29, the contractor will have completed the work needed to cover the gas main and remaining track and sidewalk work.

On October 29, crews will install the final layer of top course asphalt and permanent road markings. In order to complete this work, a full intersection closure is needed.

The intersection of Dundas Street West and Lansdowne Avenue will be fully closed on Monday, October 29, 2018 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.







The intersection will partially re-open at the end of work on October 29. All work and site restoration will be completed by 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 31.

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN TRAVELING

	<p>Traffic Management: Local access will be provided up to the intersection closure for property owners and businesses. No Frills Plaza south of Dundas should be accessed from Lansdowne Avenue.</p> <p>Through traffic motorists should consider:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bloor Street West or Queen Street West for east-west travel • Roncesvalles or Ossington Avenue for north-south travel
	<p>TTC Service: On October 29 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 505 Dundas: Buses are operating on the route and will be diverted both ways via: Dundas, Dufferin, College and Dundas. Stops not served on Dundas between Dufferin and College. • 47 Lansdowne: Buses will be diverted both ways via: Lansdowne, College, Dufferin and Queen, (looping at the south end for the return northbound trip via; MacDonell, Seaforth, Lansdowne and Queen). Stops not served on Lansdowne between College and Queen. • 402 Parkdale Community: Buses will divert both ways via; Lansdowne, College, Dundas, Howard Park, Roncesvalles and Queen. <p>TTC Service: From 7 p.m. on October 29 to 7 p.m. on October 31 Service will revert back to routing that was in place prior to the Oct 29 full closure.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 505 Dundas: Buses will resume regular service through intersection. • 47 Lansdowne: Buses will divert in a clockwise direction around the partially closed intersection using Dufferin and Lansdowne. visit ttc.ca for detailed routing. • 402 Parkdale Community: visit ttc.ca for detailed routing.
   	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: Sidewalks will remain accessible and pedestrians will be safely detoured around the work area to access local businesses.</p> <p>Cyclists: Cyclists are expected to dismount and walk around the intersection closure at Lansdowne and Dundas, or choose alternate routes.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Laneways: Laneways and driveways that serve businesses in the area will remain accessible for deliveries or service</p> <p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation should contact staff to arrange for access during construction through the contact below.</p>
