



Cleaning and Disinfecting Supply List



Supplies you will need for infection prevention and control include:

| ✓ Cleaning caddy  | ✓ Cleaning cloths and/or disinfectant wipes  |
| ✓ Appropriate disinfectant and cleaning product(s)  | ✓ Dry dust mop and/or broom  |
| ✓ Squirt bottles  | ✓ Wet loop mop and bucket and/or microfibre mop  |
| ✓ Toilet brush(es)  | ✓ Waste bins and garbage bags  |
| ✓ Alcohol-based hand rub (AHBR)  | ✓ Wet floor sign  |
| ✓ Personal Protective Equipment (e.g., gloves, gown, eye protection)  | ✓ Sharps containers  |
| ✓ Paper towels  | ✓ Tongs and/or puncture resistant gloves  |

Note:

Cleaning and disinfectant products should:

- Be able to work on the site's finishes, furnishings, surfaces, and equipment without damaging them.
- Be compatible with each other (i.e., the cleaning product should be safe to use before the disinfectant).
- Have a drug identification number (DIN) from Health Canada, if the product contains a disinfectant.
- Be used according to the product's instructions and safety data sheet (SDS).
- Not pose occupational health issues.

Additionally, disinfectant products should:

- Be pre-mixed with an expiry date OR be mixed and discarded according to the product's instructions.
- Be effective against germs that may make people sick at your site (e.g., norovirus).
- Have a short contact time, which is the amount of time that a disinfectant needs to be wet on a surface to kill germs.
