

# Solid Waste Management Services (2017)

### **OUR PORTFOLIO**

- 1 active landfill (Green Lane Landfill located in Ontario Canada approx. 200 km from downtown Toronto)
- 160 closed landfills
- 7 Transfer Stations
- 2 Organics Processing Facilities
- 1 Reuse Centre
- 4 Collection Yards & 1 Litter Collection Yard
- 6 Household Hazardous Waste Depots
- Over 600 vehicles & pieces of equipment

### **OUR CUSTOMERS**

- Service 900,000 homes & businesses
  - 461,000 single family residential (includes 11,000 residential units above commercial)

## **OUR CURRENT SITUATION**

Following two years of extensive work, Toronto's new Long Term Waste Management Strategy was approved by City Council on July 15, 2016. This comprehensive strategy will guide waste management in Toronto for the next 30-50 years.

Projected Green Lane Landfill lifespan:

- Given the latest estimates, along with the commitment to minimize the amount of garbage sent for landfill disposal, it is now anticipated Green Lane's lifespan will extend to approximately 2040
- In 2017, Toronto sent 438,511 tonnes of municipal waste to the Green Lane Landfill

### WASTE DIVERSION STATISTICS

- In 2017, Solid Waste managed approximately 942,941 tonnes of material generated within the City of Toronto:
  - 502,559 tonnes of garbage
  - 202,688 tonnes of Blue Bin recyclables
  - 158,628 tonnes of Green Bin organics
  - 74,223 tonnes of yard waste
- Combined overall residential waste diversion rate of 53% in 2017:
  - 66% single family residential homes
  - 28% multi-residential units
