

Access During Reconstruction of Albans Ramp West

Contract: 16ECS-TI-01SP
 Start Date: November 19, 2018
 Anticipated End Date: November 24, 2018

The City's contractor is working to complete improvements to the lane which connects Viking Lane to St Albans Road. To manage traffic during construction, **the roadway on Albans Ramp West, between Viking Lane and St Albans Road, will be:**

- closed to vehicle traffic to accommodate placing concrete road base November 19 to 21, 2018
- short-term temporary closures will take place November 23 to 24 to accommodate final paving of the roadway
- all properties will continue to have access from Viking Lane and St. Albans

The **WORK ZONE DETAILS** below provide information about the upcoming construction work and travel restrictions.

Work Zone Details

Motorists travelling on Viking Lane can:

- access their residences via the eastbound lanes of Dundas Street West.

Motorists travelling on St Albans Road can:

- access their residences via Auckland Road and the northbound lanes of Kipling Avenue.

Pedestrians can:

- use the sidewalk along the west side of Albans Ramp West to access Viking Lane and St Albans Road.

Signage will be placed in advance of road restrictions.

- access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, subject to safe weather conditions, with work after hours and on weekends as required and approved by the City.
	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. These efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets.
