
Watermain Replacement on Braywin Drive, Kingsview Boulevard, St. Georges Boulevard and Westhampton Drive

Contract: 18ECS-LU-16SU Start Date: September 2018 End Date: May 2019 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City's work to replace the watermain and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Braywin Drive, Kingsview Boulevard, and Westhampton Drive is progressing well. The watermain and substandard water services replacement for St. Georges Boulevard will start mid-January 2019 due to pending utility locations. Due to inclement weather conditions and pending winter season, the watermain construction will stop December 14th, 2018 and will resume mid-January 2019.

From December 15, 2018 to mid-January 2019, the contractor will not be on site. This construction work is expected to be fully completed by May 2019. An update will be provided before work re-starts in January.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

To date, the contractor has completed the following:

Installed the watermain mainline on Braywin Drive, Kingsview Boulevard, and Westhampton
Drive

In 2019, the contractor will:

- Replace the remaining water services in starting in January
- Permanently restore the trench area in the roadway and areas affected by construction in May

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

• You may continue to experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.



Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. Monday to Friday and from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. Saturday, with work after hours and on Sundays as required. Work impacting St. Phillips Road, Islington Avenue and Kipling Avenue will take place Monday to Friday from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. or on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. On a few occasions, overnight / night work will be needed at the following intersections:

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	 Braywin Drive and St. Philips Road Kingsview Blvd and Islington Ave Kingsview Blvd and Kipling Ave St. Georges Blvd and Islington Ave Westhampton Drive and Islington Ave Residents with properties closest to these areas will receive notices before the overnight / night work starts. When the new watermain is being commissioned, it must be chlorinated and disinfected. During this time water will flush and you will not see many staff on site.
	Water Service Disruptions: From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not receive advanced notice, an <i>emergency water shut off</i> may be necessary.
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your driveway access will be restricted beyond work hours, the contractor will notify you in advance and alternative parking arrangements will be made.
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	Traffic on Braywin Drive, Kingsview Boulevard, St. Georges Boulevard and Westhampton Drive will be reduced to one lane.
	Traffic will also be restricted for short durations in order to complete watermain connections on Islington Avenue, Kipling Avenue and St. Phillips Road. One lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained.
(\mathbb{R})	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .
	In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice.
	You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Field Ambassador does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
