Temporary Closure of Crescent Town Pedestrian Bridge over Victoria Park Avenue

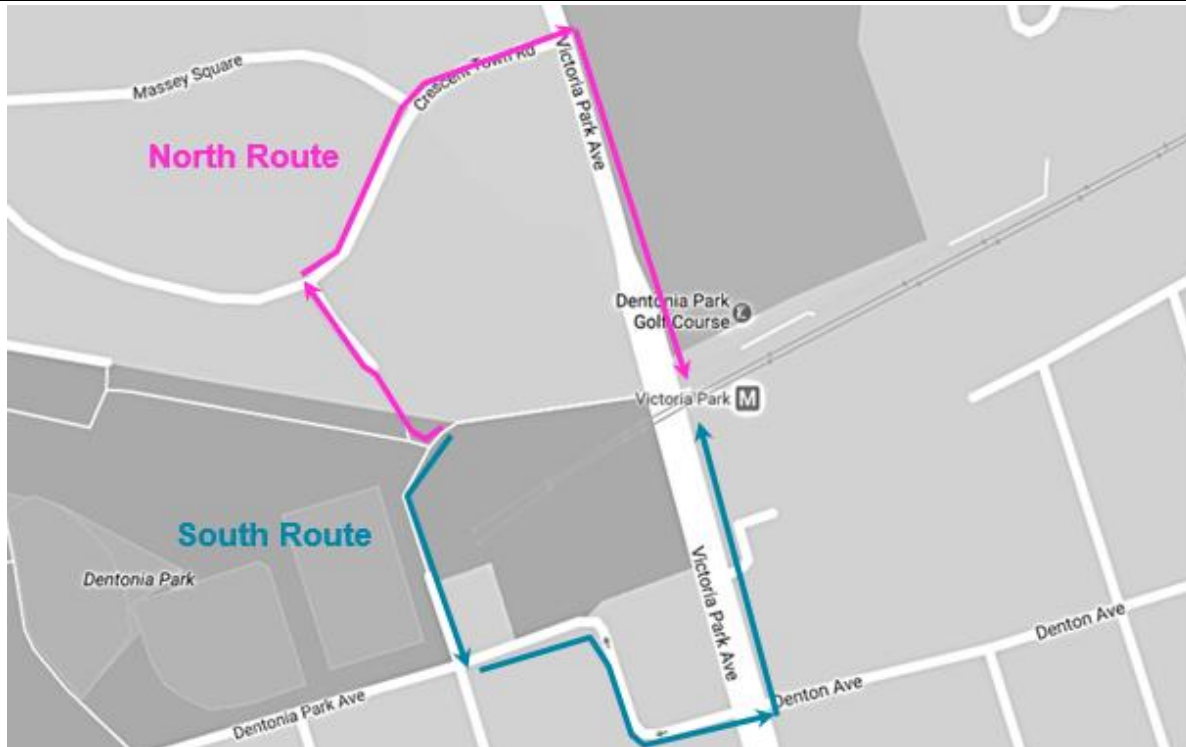
Expected Start Date: Wednesday, December 12, 2018

Expected End Date: January 2019*

The City of Toronto has temporarily closed the Crescent Town Pedestrian Bridge over Victoria Park Avenue, which connects the Victoria Park Subway Station to the Crescent Town residential buildings. The bridge will be closed to pedestrians for approximately three weeks until temporary shoring (reinforcement) is installed. This bridge is planned to be fully rehabilitated in 2019. The safety of the public is of the utmost importance so the City has temporarily closed the bridge to install shoring which will remain in place until the full rehabilitation work begins in 2019. More details about any lane restrictions will be communicated as soon as possible. We apologize for any inconvenience.

Pedestrians are advised to use the following alternative routes:

ALTERNATIVE ROUTES:



1) North Route

Follow the existing path leading north from the west end of the bridge, continue north onto Crescent Place, cross the street to the north side of Crescent Town Road and follow east until crossing the street at Victoria Park Avenue and turning south towards the Victoria Park Station.

2) South Route

Follow the existing path leading south from the west end of the bridge, continue to Thyra Avenue, then turn east onto Dentonia Park Avenue and Bryant Avenue until crossing the street at Victoria Park Avenue and turning north towards Victoria Park Station.
