

Construction Notice

Watermain Cleaning and Relining on Brimley Road from Chartland Boulevard South to Huntingwood Drive

Contract: 18TW-CTS-06CWD Start Date: December 2018 End Date: February 2019 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will be cleaning and structurally relining the watermain in your area starting in the month of December through February.

This is Phase 1 of this project on Brimley Road from Chartland Boulevard South to Huntingwood Drive. Phase 2 will begin in the spring and will take place on a different section of Brimley Road from Huntingwood Drive to Sheppard Avenue East. A separate construction notice will be distributed in the spring prior to work commencing on Phase 2.

A map of the work area can be found on page 3 of this notice.

This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to renew our aging infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk of watermain breaks.

WORK DETAILS

In the first few weeks, the City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Excavate pits in the road to access the watermain
- Clean and structurally reline the existing watermain
- Restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

 You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience



Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required. Night work may be required as part of this project. You will be notified in advance of any changes to work hours.



Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October). Permanent restoration of the curb and sidewalk will take place within 18 to 24 months.



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.



Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and pedestrians. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.



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Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.

In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, please immediately contact the Field Ambassador listed below for more information.



Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.


