

New strategic alliances such as the Comprehensive Economic Trade Agreement (CETA) between Canada and the European Union, the One Belt and One Road (OBOR) initiative connecting China to Europe, and the rapidly growing Pacific Alliance, among others, are providing a positive counterpoint to the uncertainty in international trade cause by the Brexit vote, the demise of the TPP project, and the surge of protectionist discourse. How will the new international trade picture transform the existing global trade map and its geo-economic balances? How should companies revise their growth strategies and adapt to new emerging realities? How can the public and private sectors work together to promote exports within this rapidly changing marketplace?




