## Mimico Creek Restoration at Royal York Road

**Expected Start Date: February 2019**

**Expected End Date: March 2019**

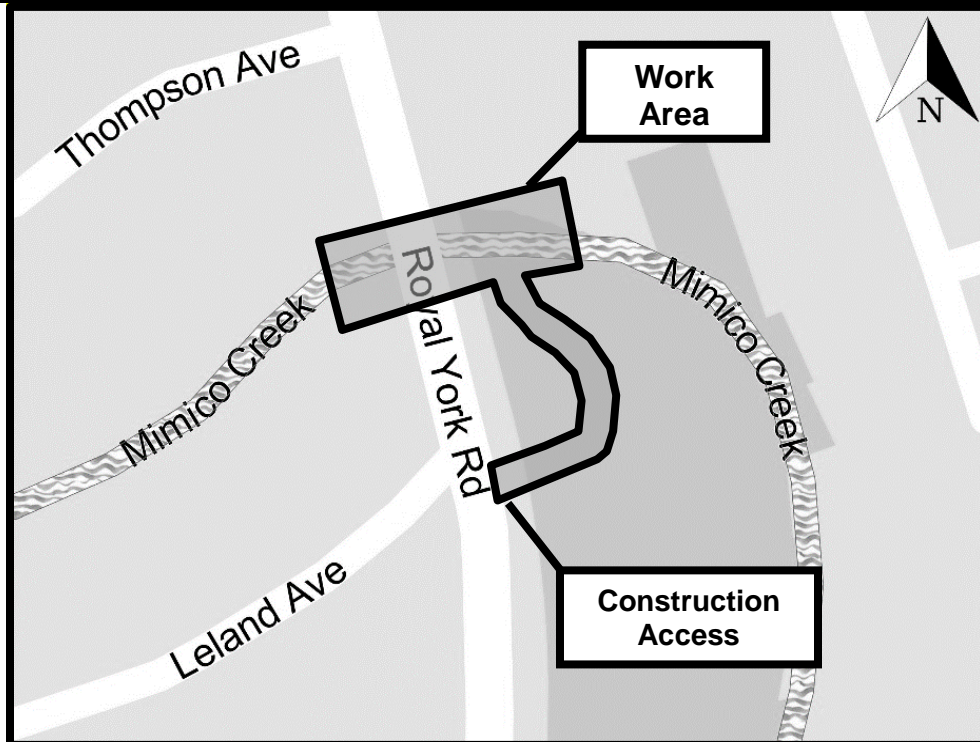

The City of Toronto is planning to restore a section of Mimico Creek at Royal York Road that has been damaged due to erosion. The work area is behind properties on Thompson Avenue and Royal York Road as shown on the map below.

The creek restoration will consist of installing a new storm sewer outfall and removing abandoned sanitary sewer and watermain infrastructure. The storm sewer outlet is part of the City's stormwater infrastructure designed to collect stormwater and melting snow and release it into Mimico Creek. The removal of the abandoned sanitary sewer and watermain infrastructure is to address existing erosion conditions in the creek.

This restoration project is part of the Council-Approved 2019 Capital Works Program and the City's stormwater infrastructure improvement program that will improve water quality in Mimico Creek.

## WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Build a construction access to the work area off of Royal York Road.
- Manage traffic at the construction access along Royal York Road to ensure construction equipment enters and exits safely with minimal traffic disruptions.
- Work within Mimico Creek to remove abandoned infrastructure and build a new storm sewer outfall.

## WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before construction begins with more information about the work.

	<p><b>Access to Your Home:</b> The City-hired contractor may need access to your home to complete a pre-construction survey. Affected properties will receive a pre-construction survey request to schedule a time to complete the survey.</p>
	<p><b>Trees Removal:</b> due to the nature of this project, the City will have to remove trees from private and public property in the ravine. Affected property owners will receive a separate notice. Private and public property tree removal permits have been obtained in coordination with the City's Parks, Recreation &amp; Forestry Division. Trees removed for the project will be replaced using a replacement ratio of three trees planted for every one tree removed.</p>
