## Watermain Replacement and Road Resurfacing on Yatesbury Road

**\* NEW End Date: Spring 2019**

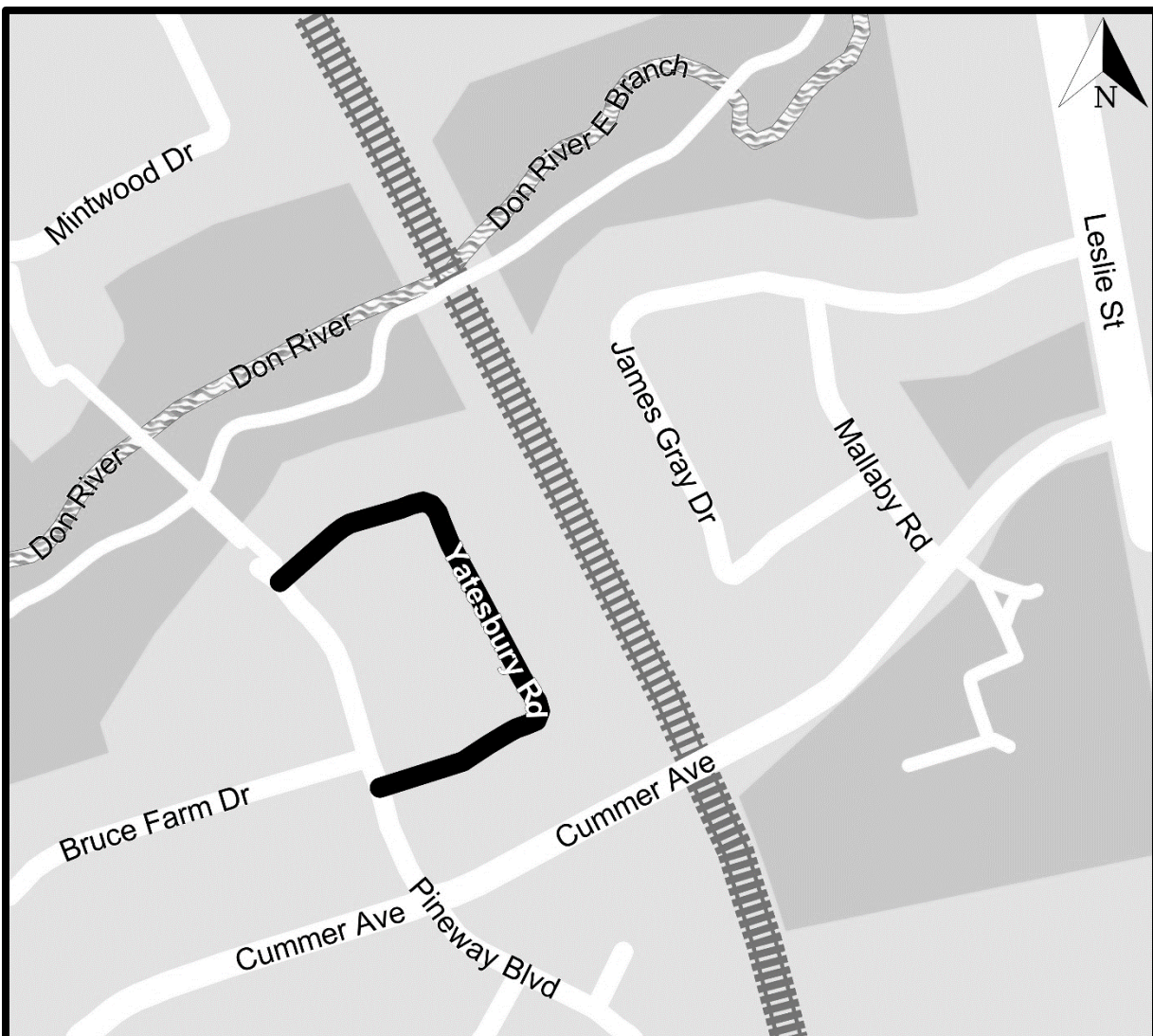

In August, The City of Toronto started to replace the watermain and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Yatesbury Road. This work has been completed. On the odd-numbered side of the road, the entire sidewalk was also replaced as well as sections of sidewalk on the even-numbered side of the road. Sections of curb were replaced and driveway restorations were completed. Top soil was also placed.

At this time, road resurfacing and sod placement work will resume in Spring 2019. This is because paving work requires consistently warmer and drier weather (+7 degrees), which does not occur at this time of year.

We recognize that a project of this nature is disruptive to the community and apologize for the inconveniences caused by the delayed end date. A new notice will be issued before work starts in the Spring.
