Access during road reconstruction on Bloor Street West and Beamish Drive

Contract: 16ECS-TI-01SP | Start Date: Sunday February 24, 2019 | Anticipated End Date: Summer 2019

The City's contractor is working to complete improvements to Bloor Street West and Beamish Drive as part of the Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration. To manage traffic during construction, effective February 24, 2019:

- The roadway island at Beamish Drive and Bloor Street will be permanently removed.
- Access from Beamish Drive to Dundas Street west will be temporarily closed.
- The north side of Dundas Street West will be reconstructed.

The **WORK ZONE DETAILS** below provide information about the upcoming construction work and travel restrictions. Please refer to project webpage and Construction Update 8 for more information: toronto.ca/etobicokecentre.

WORK ZONE DETAILS

Motorists travelling on Bloor Street West can:

- Access Beamish Drive
- Access Dundas Street West to travel east or west via Kipling Avenue
- Travel north or south on Kipling Avenue

Motorists travelling on Beamish Drive can:

- turn left or right onto Bloor Street West

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City is making every effort to reduce the impacts.

	Work Hours will take place from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm., Monday to Friday, subject to safe weather conditions, with work after hours and on weekends as required and approved by the City.
	Pedestrian access will be provided to all residents and businesses during this stage along the north side of Dundas Street with access to Six Points Plaza and Beamish Drive.
	Road and driveway access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Adequate signage will be placed in advance of any sidewalk restrictions. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. These efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets.
