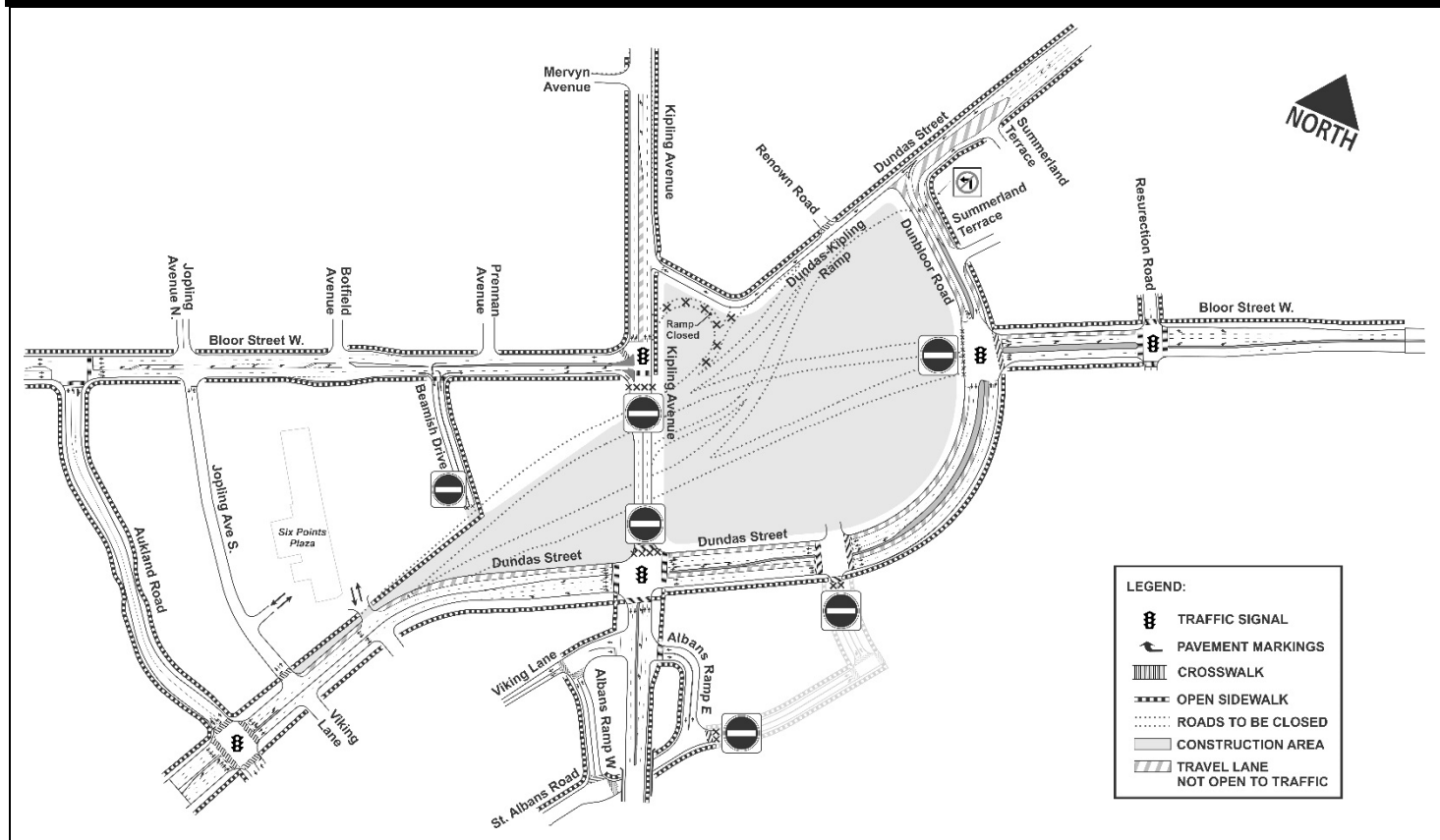

In order to safely remove the Dundas Street West and Bloor Street West bridges spanning over Kipling Avenue, there will be a full closure of Kipling Avenue between Dundas Street West and Bloor Street West commencing at 7 P.M Friday March 8, 2019 and reopening at 5 A.M Tuesday March 12, 2019.

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN TRAVELLING

Motorists travelling North on Kipling Avenue, can:




- Travel west on Dundas Street, north on Aukland Road, and East on Bloor Street W., to re-join Kipling Avenue; or
- Travel west on Dundas Street West (north of Bloor Street West) and use the Dundas/Kipling Ramp to re-join Kipling Avenue.

Motorists travelling South on Kipling Avenue, can:




- Travel west on Bloor Street West, south on Aukland Road and east on Dundas Street West to re-join Kipling Avenue; or
- Travel south on Dunbloor Road and west on Dundas Street West to re-join Kipling Avenue.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p>Overnight Work Hours: Work will take place 24-hours a day for the entire weekend. The contractor will use extended work hours to minimize traffic disruption and congestion.</p> <p>Be advised, that overnight work will involve loud noise, such as concrete saw cutting, concrete grinding and concrete removal (e.g. tolls and machinery), placing concrete into trucks (banging) and beeping trucks backing-up.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Adequate signage will be placed in advance of any sidewalk restrictions.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets.</p> <p>Please visit our website for information on possible alternate routes to aid your travel: toronto.ca/etobicokecentre</p>

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN WALKING/TAKING TRANSIT

	<p>Pedestrians: Due to the nature of the work and safety reasons, pedestrians will not be able to use the sidewalk within the construction area from Friday March 8 at 7 P.M to Tuesday March 12 at 5 A.M</p> <p>Signage will be placed ahead of the intersection to notify pedestrians to use adjacent streets to move north and south.</p>
	<p>Transit Service: This project will affect travel times of a number of TTC and MiWay routes to and from Kipling Subway Station that travel along Kipling Avenue. Visit ttc.ca or mississauga.ca/portal/miway for accurate schedule information.</p>
	<p>Village of Islington BIA and Local Businesses will be open throughout construction. All are welcome to dine, shop and play!</p>
