Road Resurfacing, Watermain Decommissioning on Scarlett Road and Road Resurfacing on St. Clair Avenue West

Expected Start Date: June 2019

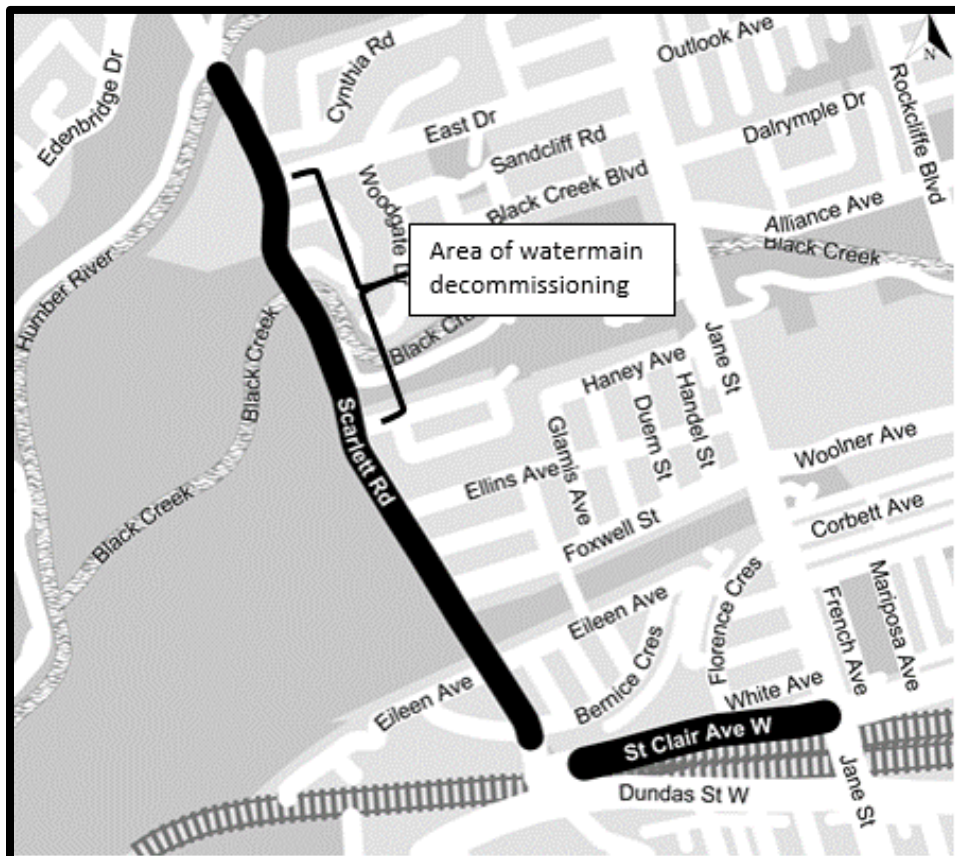
Expected End Date: September 2019

The City of Toronto will resurface the road on Scarlett Road from Humber River to Bernice Crescent and on St. Clair Avenue West from 100 metres east of Scarlett Road to the west limit of the Jane Street intersection. As part of this project, the City will decommission an existing old cast iron watermain on Scarlett Road from Edinborough Court Drive to East Drive.



Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. This work is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager listed below.
