## Watermain Cleaning and Relining under Highway 404 from Allenbury Gardens and Muirhead Road

**Contract: 17TW-OS-02CWD**  
**Start Date: March 2019**  
**End Date: May 2019**  
*\*Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto will be cleaning and structurally relining the watermain in your area starting in the month of March.

There are two Phases to this cleaning and relining project. Phase 1 of this project from Highway 404 to Allenbury Gardens was completed in December 2018. Restorations will follow in spring 2019. Phase 2 will begin in March 2019 and will take place from Highway 404 to Muirhead Road. The Ministry of Transportation of Ontario has approved a work plan that involves temporarily taking down a section of the sound barrier on the east side of Highway 404 in order to access the watermain. The sound barrier will be reinstalled once this work is complete.

This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to renew our aging infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk of watermain breaks.





### WORK DETAILS

In the first few weeks, the City’s contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area and temporarily take down a section of the sound barrier before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Excavate pits in the road to access the watermain
- Clean and structurally reline the existing watermain
- Re-install the Highway 404 sound barrier
- Restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required. Overnight work will be required for approximately 1-2 weeks during this project and will take place from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Overnight work is required to remove and reinstall the sound barrier.
	<b>Noise:</b> You may experience intermittent noise and vibration during construction.
	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	<b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and pedestrians. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.

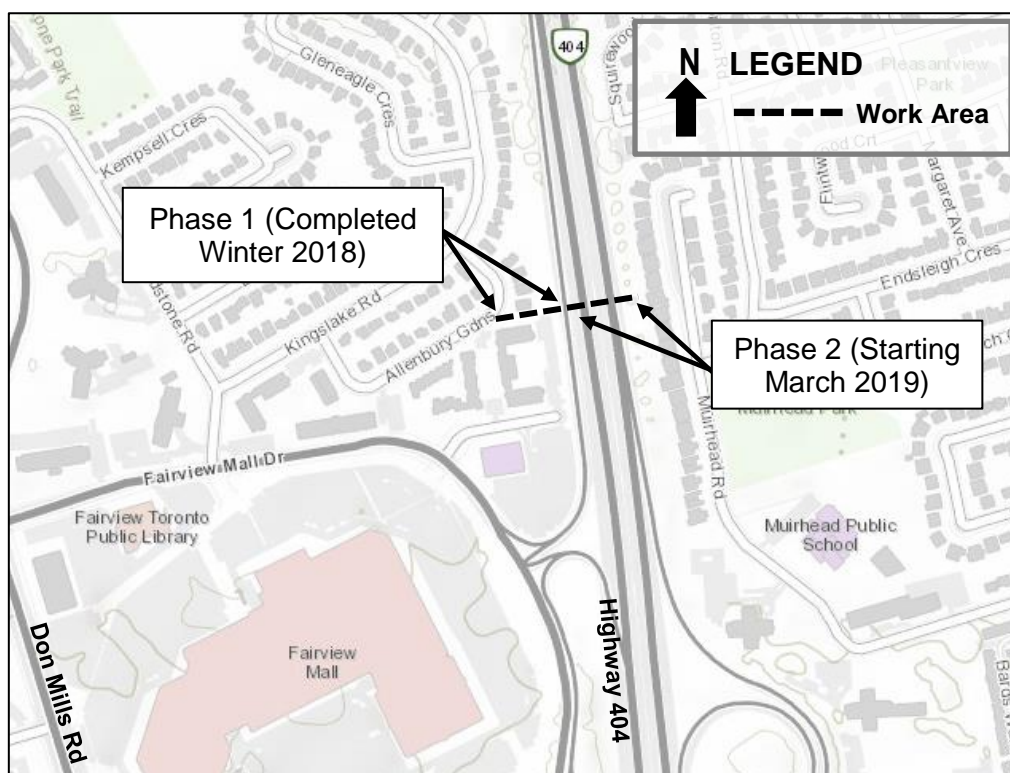
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October). Permanent restoration of the curb and sidewalk will take place within 18 to 24 months.</p>
	<p><b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, please immediately contact the Field Ambassador listed below for more information.</p>
	<p><b>Garbage &amp; Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p>
