Road Reconstruction on Glen Road from Beaumont Road to Summerhill Avenue and north of Summerill Avenue

Contract: 18ECS-TI-19LR

Start Date: April 23, 2019

End Date: October 31, 2019

**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto will reconstruct the road and replace the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Glen Road from Beaumont Road to Summerhill Avenue and from Summerhill Avenue to 337 Glen Road. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs reconstruction and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair

The water service is the underground pipe that brings water to your water meter and is owned by you and by the City. The part you own is from your house to the end of your property, the part the City owns is from the end of your property to the watermain.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs. The work will also implement a number of intersection improvements as part of the City's Vision Zero Road Safety Plan to create a safe and healthy city by eliminating all fatalities and serious injuries

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD WATER SERVICES

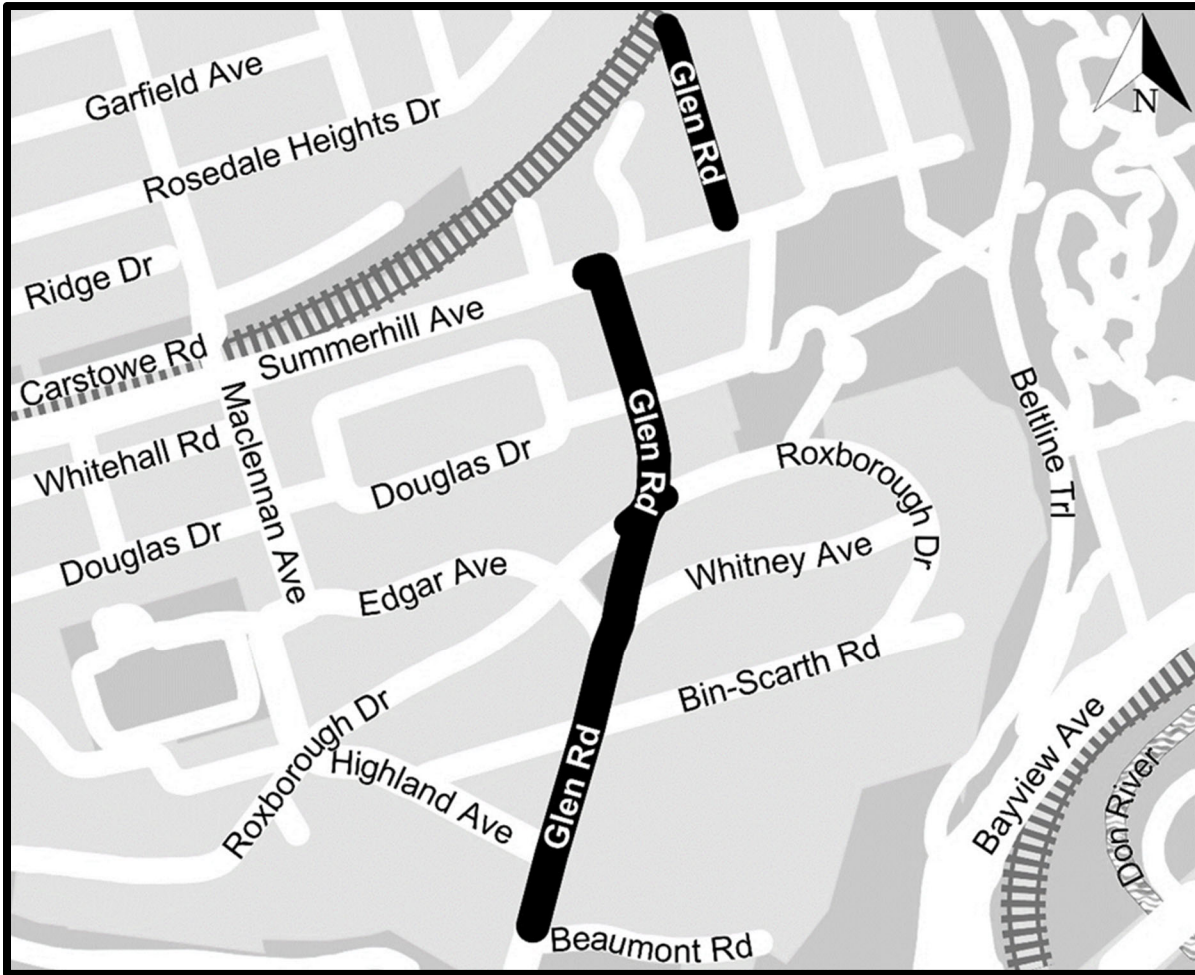
If you live on Glen Road in a house that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Please read the attached fact sheet with important information about the risks of lead in drinking water, especially if someone in your house is pregnant, there are children under six years old, or there is an infant drinking formula made using tap water.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Dig up the road surface
- Replace any City-owned water service pipes that do not meet City standards from the watermain to the private property line
- Re-align maintenance holes and catch basins
- Repair curbs, gutters and driveways
- Repave the road surface

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: Wristen's Home Specialties Inc. (WHS) under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will wear photo identification and carry photographic equipment during their work.</p>
	<p>Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please take the time to read the attached fact sheet carefully as it contains important information on lead in drinking water and how to prepare for replacement. If you want to replace your part of the water service pipe, contact the City's contractor for one of your quotes.</p> <p>Water Service Replacement Contractor:</p> <p>Company/Contractor: GTA Underground Services Inc. 	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>Traffic on Glen Road will be reduced to one northbound lane only for the whole project.</p>

	<p>TTC Service: This project may affect travel times on the 82 Rosedale bus; visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information. Some bus stop locations may be temporarily re-located along Glen Road during construction.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. <i>You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Project Manager does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.</i></p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
