## Proposed Oakwood Neighbourhood Cycling Connections Vaughan Road and Northcliffe Boulevard

Cycling is one of the fastest growing transportation modes in Toronto. The City is working to make travel by bike safer and more inviting.

### Project Overview

The City of Toronto is proposing to install cycling infrastructure in the Oakwood neighbourhood. The proposed cycling routes include:

- Northbound bike lane on Vaughan Road from Oakwood Avenue to Northcliffe Boulevard
- Southbound shared lane on Vaughan Road from Oakwood Avenue to Northcliffe Boulevard
- Shared lanes on Vaughan Road from Northcliffe Boulevard to the west limit
- A contra-flow bike lane and shared lane on Northcliffe Boulevard from Rogers Road to Vaughan Road

The new cycling would expand the local cycling network by providing improved connections to the existing bike lane on Rogers Road and the future cycle tracks on Eglinton Avenue. **Please refer to examples below and area map on reverse.**



**Bike lane:** a dedicated part of the roadway for the exclusive use of cyclists. Other road users may not lawfully drive, stand, stop or park in a designated bicycle lane.



**Contra-flow Bike Lane:** allows cyclists to travel in two directions on a one-way street. Cyclists travel in one direction in the mixed-use traffic lane. When travelling in the opposite direction, the cyclist will travel in the marked cycle lane.



**Shared Lane Markings (Sharrows):** road markings used to indicate a shared lane for motor vehicles and bicycles.

### Public Drop-in Event

At this public drop-in event, attendees will have an opportunity to:

- View the draft designs for the proposed cycling infrastructure
- Ask questions and speak to City of Toronto staff
- Provide feedback on the proposed designs

All information materials will be posted on the project website on the day of the event. For those unable to attend the event, feedback will be accepted online between April 23 and May 7.

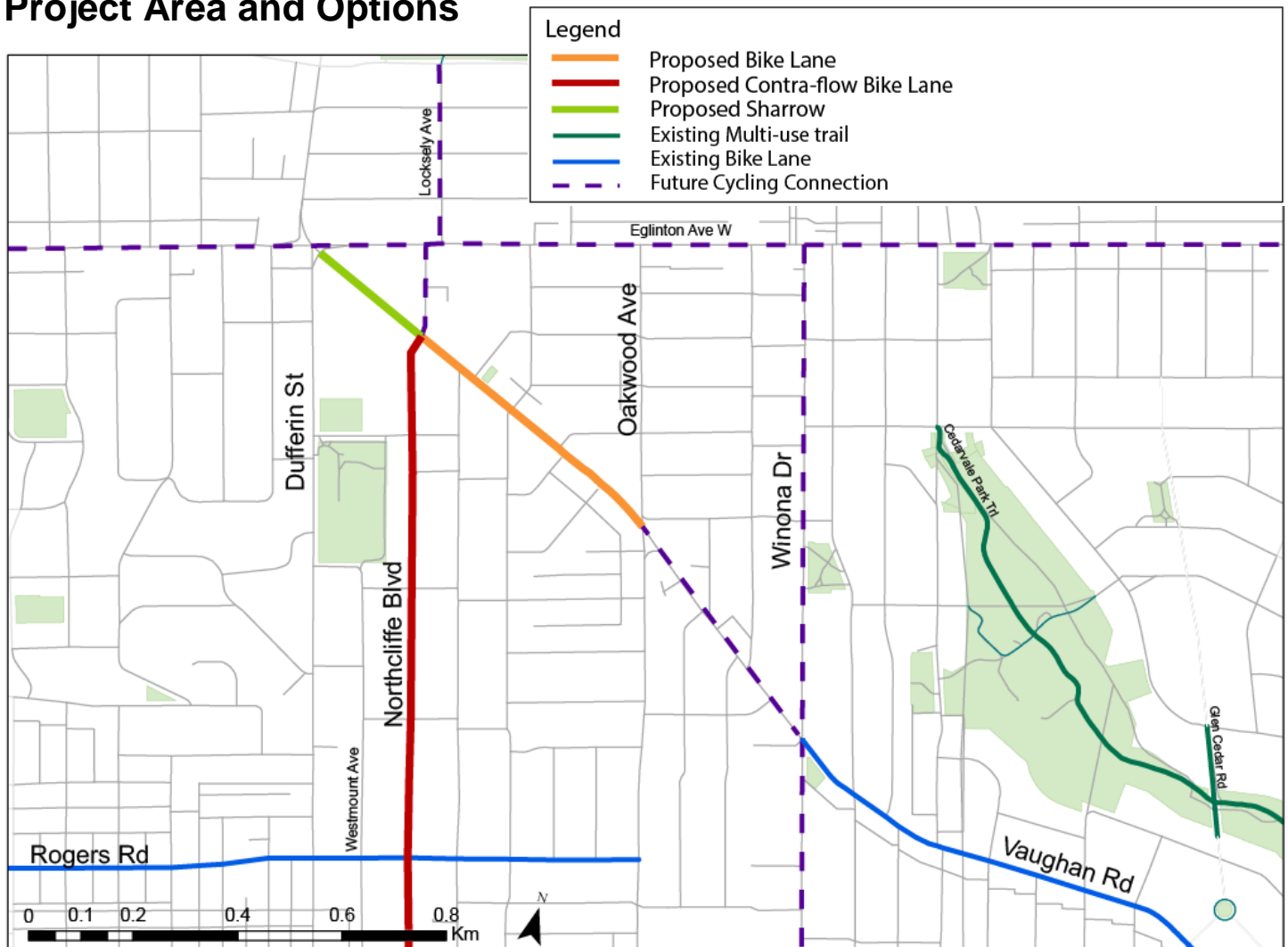

## Project Area and Options



### What would these cycling routes mean for you?

- Parking: some changes to on-street permit and pay and display parking, including:
  - Vaughan Road (Bansley Avenue to Northcliffe Boulevard): remove pay and display parking from east side of street and move permit parking from east side to west side of street.
  - Northcliffe Boulevard (Rogers Road to Vaughan Road): move all permit parking to east side of street.
- Removal or changes to some curb extensions on Northcliffe Boulevard.
- No impacts to vehicle travel times and turning movements are anticipated.
- TTC bus routes will be maintained. No significant changes to TTC stops.
- No changes to Wheel-Trans, emergency services, garbage pick-up or other City services.
