
Crescent Road Bridge Repair over TTC

Contract: 17ECS-TI-07BE Original Expected Start Date: March 19, 2019 NEW Expected Start Date: May 2019 NEW Expected End Date: July 2019 *Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto is planning to repair the east approach slab and repave the Crescent Road Bridge over TTC at Rosedale Station. However, due to unforeseen delays with other bridge repair projects associated with this contract, the schedule for this work has changed.

The work is now expected to start mid-May until July 2019. A Construction Update with exact start dates will be sent out to nearby properties at least a week before work starts.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Construct new 300mm thick concrete approach slab at the east side of the bridge
- Remove 40mm of asphalt over bridge deck and approach slabs and re-pave

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

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Construction Update #1

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area. One sidewalk will remain open at all times with closures on the north and south side of Crescent Road alternating.
8	 Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. The westbound and eastbound lanes on Crescent Road will be closed alternatively from Yonge Street to Cluny Drive, and one shared lane will be provided. Flaggers with stop/slow signs will manage the traffic during working hours; Yield to Oncoming Traffic signs to be provided.
(\mathbb{R})	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. Please contact parking control for the location of your vehicle at 416-808-2222 .
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed during construction will be replaced.
Ġ	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, clear sidewalk path etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.
