Watermain Replacement on St. Mathias Place from Robinson Street to 5 St. Mathias Place



In February 2019, the City of Toronto started the replacement of the watermain on St. Mathias Place from Robinson Street to 5 St. Mathias Place. The watermain and substandard water services have been replaced on St. Mathias Place from Robinson Street to 5 St. Mathias Place.

The Contractor has completed temporary restorations of the work zone in late April 2019. All permanent restorations will be scheduled to be undertaken in Fall 2019.

We recognize that a project of this nature is disruptive to the community and apologize for the inconveniences caused by construction.

WORK DETAILS

To date, the City's Contractor has:

- Completed the replacement of the watermain on St. Mathias Place from Robinson Street to 5 St. Mathias Place.
- Completed the transfer of water service connections on the new watermain.
- Completed the removal of the old fire hydrants.
- Completed all temporary restorations.

Starting in Fall 2019, the Contractor will:

• Complete all permanent restorations inclusive of curb and surface asphalt paving over disturbed areas.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

(\mathbf{L})	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Driveway Access: The Contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	Traffic on St. Mathias Place within the identified work area will be fully closed, with local access for residents along St. Mathias Place permitted.
(\mathbb{R})	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .

Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the Contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.	
Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
