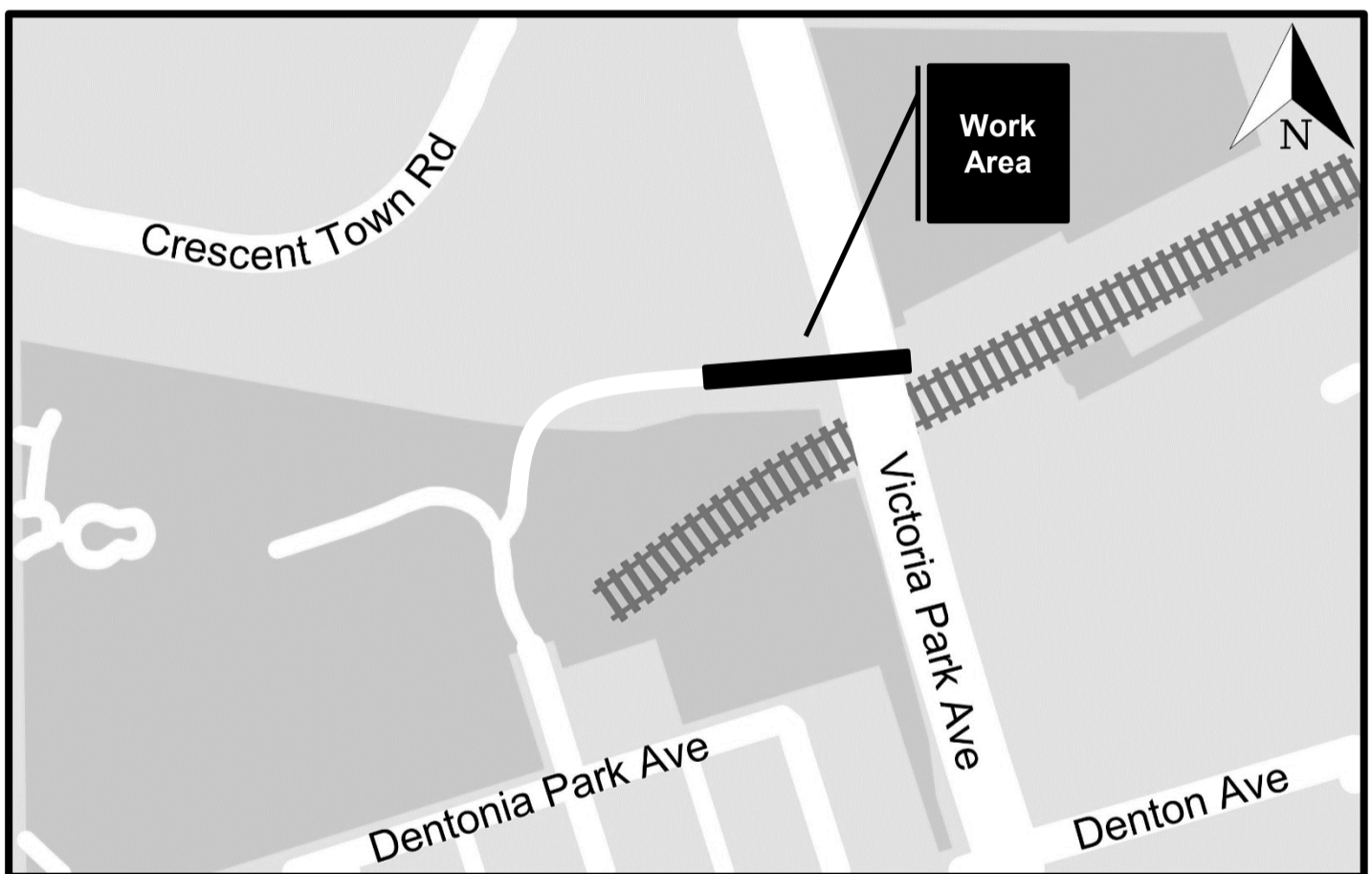

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate the Crescent Town Pedestrian Bridge. Work will involve: concrete repairs, bearing replacement, installing louver panels between the windows and columns to prevent rainwater from entering the existing bridge, replacing the roof, and installing a non-slip floor sealant.




This project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to bring infrastructure to a good state of repair.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before the work begins with more information about the work.
- In the first few weeks, the City's contractor will move equipment on-site to a laydown area on the west side of Victoria Park Avenue and prepare the work area before construction begins.
- In order to accommodate the work, lane restrictions will be required on Victoria Park Avenue.
- Ten to twelve overnight closures of the bridge to pedestrian traffic will be scheduled. Closure notices will be posted in advance.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as approved by the City.</p> <p>Overnight Work: Ten to twelve overnight work shifts will be required between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. as approved by the City. Notice will be provided.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Sidewalks will remain accessible.</p> <p>Pedestrian Bridge: The bridge will remain open at all times, with the exception of ten to twelve overnight closures from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m.</p>
	<p>Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored.</p>
