Road Resurfacing on streets in Baby Point

The City of Toronto is planning to resurface the road on the following streets in Baby Point:

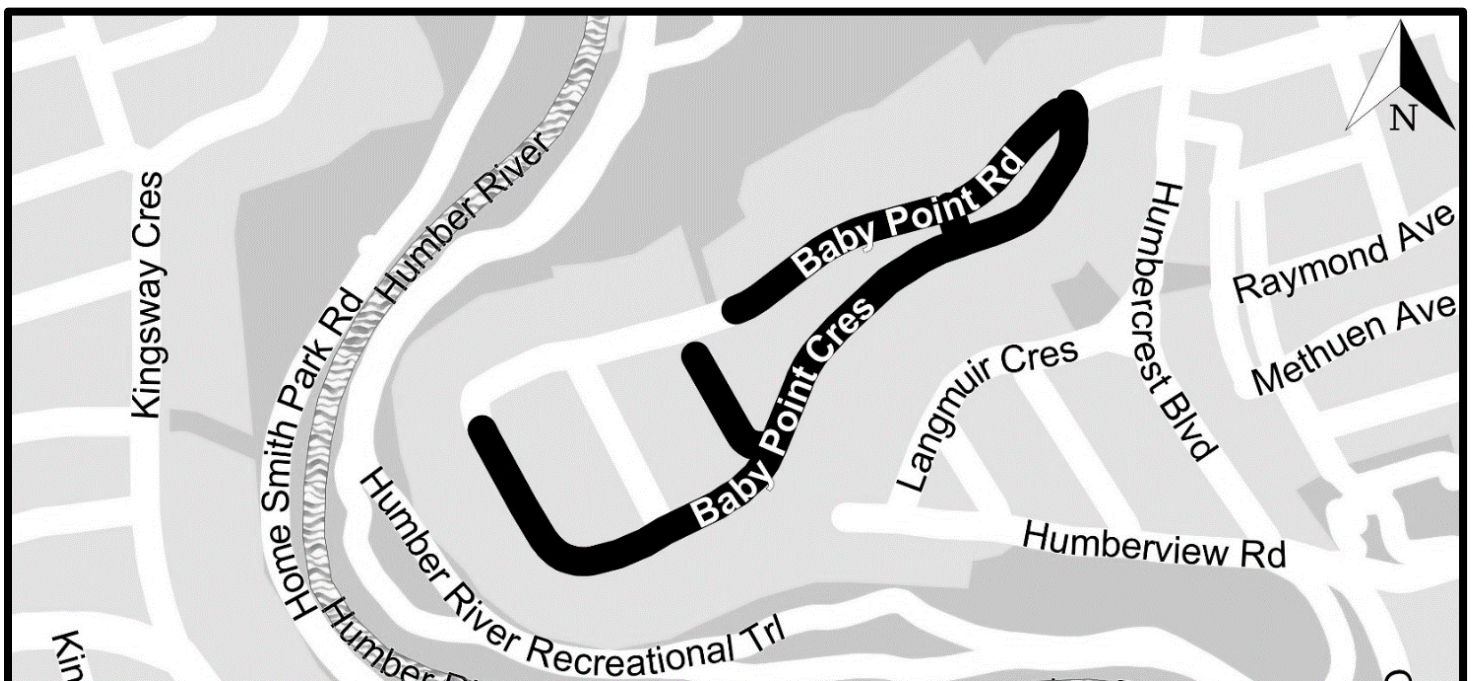
- Baby Point Crescent from Baby Point Road to 79 Baby Point Crescent
- Baby Point Road from Baby Point Crescent to 92 Baby Point Road
- Baby Point Terrace from Baby Point Crescent to North Limit
- Fleur Place from Baby Point Crescent to Baby Point Road

Our inspection of the roads show that they are in need of repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

A portion of Baby Point Road and Baby Point Crescent will be resurfaced after the City completes future sewer installation work.



This work is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.

	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
