Study Area and Process

The study area is bounded to the north by St. Clair Avenue West, to the west by Bathurst Street, to the east by Avenue Road and to the south by Dupont Street.

The TMMP evaluated the existing traffic conditions surrounding Casa Loma, and then proposed preliminary improvement alternatives to address traffic and parking issues that arise within the study area. These preliminary improvement alternatives were presented at the first round of engagement in the Fall 2018. The project team then evaluated the preliminary improvement alternatives based on public feedback and socio economic, cultural environment, transportation, and construction considerations. A list of recommended alternatives has now been developed.
