Sanitary Main Replacement on Roxborough Drive from Mount Pleasant Road to Highland Avenue

Contract: 18TW-CTS-19CWD
Expected Start Date: July 2019
Expected End Date: November 2019


The City of Toronto will replace the sanitary forcemain (a pressurized sewer pipe that transports wastewater from a lower to higher elevation) on Roxborough Drive from Mount Pleasant Road to Highland Avenue. This work also involves connecting the sanitary forcemain to the existing Roxborough Sewage Pumping Station and modifying the station's internal piping to allow the connection.

The sewage pumping station is a facility which pumps sewage uphill from low points in the sanitary sewer network. The

This type of construction work is required to proceed in stages and therefore the entire work area will not necessarily be under construction at the same time.

This work is needed as the existing sanitary forcemain has reached the end of its life cycle. This project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew aging infrastructure reducing the risk of forcemain breaks and collapses.

WORK DETAILS

In the first few weeks, the City’s contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Clear the work area in the parkette and fence it off to protect the public from the construction site. Removal of 7 small diameter (4 to 12cm) trees is required to allow space for construction equipment.
- Install sections of the sanitary forcemain using a trenchless method that does not require excavation.
- Access and install the remainder of the new sanitary forcemain using limited excavation in the road.
- Connect the new sanitary forcemain to the sewage pumping station and modify the piping inside.
- Restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass when the underground works are complete.
- Plant approximately 60 new native species trees in the parkette as part of the City's Tree & Ravine Protection permit process to replace the trees that will be removed.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard or close to the property line, please contact the Project Designer.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday. Work after hours or on weekends may be required. You will be notified in advance of any changes to work hours.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: Global Project Management (GPMenvironmental), under contract to the City of Toronto, will contact all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts to ask for participation in a survey. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The survey inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles and pedestrians will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Partial Park / Trail Closure: The south portion of the Roxborough Parkette will be closed during construction for public and worker safety. Detour and Closure signage will be installed to help trail users navigate around the closure.</p>

	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>Traffic on Roxborough Drive will be reduced to one lane during portions of the construction duration.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle on the street affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. <i>You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Project Manager does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.</i></p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October). Permanent restoration work will take place within 18 to 24 months.</p>
