Bermondsey Sanitary Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation near Don River East Branch

Contract: 18ECS-LU-02TT Expected Start Date: Summer 2019 Expected End Date: Summer 2020 *Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Bermondsey Sanitary Trunk Sewer (STS). The Bermondsey STS is located south of Old Eglinton Avenue, west of Bermondsey Road and next to the Don River East Branch ravine.

The sanitary trunk sewer is an underground pipe that collects wastewater from various streets and conveys it to the Wastewater Treatment Plant located near Lake Ontario.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew the City's aging sewer infrastructure and will extend the service life of these trunk sewer sections by approximately 50 years.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Majority of the work is taking place in the ravine area close to the Don River East Branch watercourse.

- The sewer pipe will be rehabilitated using a trenchless method.
- Construction crews will install temporary pumps and pipes to divert flow from the sewer so that it can be repaired from the inside.
- A sock filled with resin will be inserted into the sewer pipe through maintenance holes and the sock is then cured with steam forming a new pipe inside the old sewer.

Internation Pre-Construction Notice

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Before construction starts in August 2019, a construction notice will be provided to area residents providing more precise information regarding the construction duration and specific closures.
- Work crews will mark underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable to ensure they are not affected by the work.
- Majority of this work will occur within City Parks and Toronto Region and Conservation Authority lands.
- A portion of the sewer passes close to the Victoria Village Arena and there are maintenance holes located in the Arena parking lot.
- Parking alternatives will be provided for affected spots during construction as needed.
- There will be construction activity in the parking lot for a few months. An impact to area permits and use is not anticipated, construction fence will be installed to separate the construction work from Arena activities.

Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the **Project Manager** to arrange for access during the construction period.
