The City of Toronto continues reconstructing the Six Points Interchange. There will be a full closure of vehicle access to the Dundas/Kipling Ramp from Tuesday August 6, 2019 at 7 a.m. to Friday August 16, 2019 at 5 p.m. for road reconstruction including full depth reconstruction of the ramp, pouring of a new road base, installation of curbs and paving.

The maps and information below provide information about the open and closed areas. Drivers, pedestrians and cyclists please be aware and obey the traffic movements, signs and signals. **More information: toronto.ca/etobicokecentre**

WORK ZONE DETAILS

The contractor will open access to motorists wishing to enter and exit the plaza during construction with the use of steel plates over areas of construction. Pedestrian access will remain along the north side of Dundas Street West. Renown Road will remain open during construction for alternative access driveway.

Dundas Street West, between Dunbloor Road and Kipling Avenue, will remain accessible to local traffic for the completion of road reconstruction until the end of 2019.
