Purpose	To obtain authority for the City to consent, as owner of Part of 80 Dale Avenue, Toronto, to an application for development approval, by Podium Development Corp., on behalf of 80 Dale Avenue Ltd. (the "Applicant").				
Property	The City-owned lands described as a portion of 80 Dale Avenue, Toronto, being Parts 6 & 9 on the draft reference plan, attached as Appendix "A" (the "Property").

Financial Impact	There is no financial impact resulting from this approval.				
Background	The former Metropolitan Toronto acquired the lands comprising of Parts 1 to 9, inclusive on the attached draft reference plan in connection with the Scarborough Transportation Corridor (STC) project. Plans for the STC were abandoned in the 1970's.				
	The eastern portion of 80 Dale Avenue, designated as Parts 3, 4, 5, 7, 8 and 10 on the attached draft reference plan were transferred to Build Toronto Inc. ("Build Toronto"). 80 Dale Avenue Ltd. is the successful proponent for the Build Toronto development site and became the registered owner of Parts 3, 4, 5, 7 8 and 10 on the attached draft reference plan on December 14, 2017. The western half of 80 Dale Avenue, designated as Parts 1, 2, 6 and 9 on the attached draft reference plan are under the operation and control of Parks, Forestry and Recreation (PF&R). 80 Dale Avenue Ltd. also acquired ownership of the property at 66 Dale Avenue, being Part 11 on the draft reference plan, and expressed interest in a land exchange with the City, whereby 80 Dale Avenue Ltd. would acquire Parts 6 & 9 in exchange for Parts 10 & 11 to the City. The size of Parts 10 and 11 are equivalent to that of Parts 6 and 9, both being 1,212 m².				
	PF&R is in agreement with the proposed land exchange as the land exchange would provide the City a more regular, rectangular shaped parcel, more suitable for parkland use.				
Comments	The City is in the process of negotiating the land exchange agreement with the Applicant. The Applicant is required secure the necessary municipal planning approvals for their proposed development. The Development Approval Application for Site Plan Control is to be made by the land owner and, therefore, the City's consent is required for the Applicant to submit this application. The letter of consent that will be provided to the Applicant will expressly state that the City's consent is being given solely in the City's capacity as land owner and that by giving such consent, the City shall not be deemed to support endorse the planning merits of the Application, nor to fetter City Council's discretion, and is given without prejudice to the negotiations regarding the land exchange between 80 Dale Avenue Ltd. And the City regarding the above referenced portions of 80 Dale Avenue.

General Conditions ("GC")

- (a) The local Councillor (or local Councillors if the subject property is located on a ward boundary or if the transaction involves an exchange of properties in more than one ward), will be consulted prior to the exercise of delegated Approving Authority by staff for all Acquisitions, Disposals, Land Exchanges and Leases. In the event of a vacancy in the Ward in which the subject property is located, the Mayor's office shall be consulted in the alternative.
- (b) Where approving power has been delegated to staff, the Deputy City Manager, Corporate Services, in consultation with any other applicable Deputy City Manager or the City Manager, may determine that such matter is of such special interest that same should be returned to the relevant Committee and Council for consideration and determination.
- (c) Exercise of delegated authority is subject to all applicable Council policies, statutes or other applicable law.
- (d) Authority to approve financial commitments/expenditures is subject to all amounts being available in an approved budget, or funding being available from third party sources, except for "Strategic Property Acquisitions" as set out in EX44.22 adopted by Council August 25, 26, 27 and 28, 2014, which identifies alternative funding mechanisms subject to additional approval requirements.
- (e) Property interests are to be based on appraised value, and no interest shall be granted at less than market value unless otherwise specifically authorized.
- (f) Authority to approve transactions at less than market value is subject to statutory anti-bonusing provisions.
- (g) Total compensation means the aggregate of all types of payments, including land value, estimated clean-up costs, potential arbitration awards, loss claims, etc., but exclusive of any applicable taxes and registration costs.
- (h) Authority to acquire property is conditional upon provision being made to bring the property into compliance with applicable MOE or other requirements such that it will be fit for its intended municipal purpose, except for property acquisitions of 50M² or less for transit shelter purposes.
- (i) Authority to initiate the permanent road closure process in A.4 is conditional upon confirmation by the GM of Transportation Services that it is feasible to permanently close the highway.
- (j) Disposal authorities in A.7 are subject to the property having been declared surplus, and the disposal policy complied with.
- (k) Land exchanges, except for those in A.8, may be authorized based on the delegated Approving Authority for disposals in A.7.
- (I) Approving Authority with respect to land located in the Designated Waterfront Area as defined in the *Toronto Waterfront Revitalization Corporation Act*, 2002 is conditional upon the approval of the Director, Waterfront Secretariat.
- (m) Authority to approve an exchange of land in A.8 is conditional upon confirmation by the Chief Planner and Executive Director of City Planning, and the GM of Parks, Forestry & Recreation, that the land being exchanged is (i) nearby land of equivalent or larger area, and (ii) of comparable or superior green space utility.
- (n) Approving Authority in A.9 Leases (City as Landlord) but not Licences (City as Licensor) is limited to periods (including options/renewals) of less than twenty-one (21) years, as leases of 21 years or more may be authorized based on the delegated Approving Authority for disposals in A.7.
- (o) Total compensation in leasing matters where the City is landlord (A.9) includes the value of tenant improvements if factored into tenant's rental payments.
- (p) Total compensation in leasing matters where the City is the tenant (A.10) includes the value of any tenant improvements to be paid by the City.
- (q) Where options/renewals are included in leases, if the renewal rent is to be determined at a date later than the original approval date, total compensation is to be calculated as though all options are exercised, estimating the renewal rent based on the highest rent payable in the first term of the lease.
- (r) Total compensation in leasing matters where the City is landlord (A.9) or tenant (A.10) is to be calculated from the date of approval pursuant to this delegation (ie. first allowing for the expiry of any prior approvals, whether by Council or a delegated authority).
- (s) Approving Authority in leasing matters includes authority to approve renewals/extensions within the parameters of the delegated Approving Authority.
- (t) Approving Authority includes authority for amendments within the parameters of the delegated Approving Authority, the cumulative total of which may not exceed the delegated financial limit.
- (u) Where proposed additional amounts in A.13 exceed 10 per cent of the original decision, even if otherwise in compliance with all other conditions, then Approving Authority is transferred upwards to the next more senior level of Approving Authority having the relevant overall financial limit.
- (v) Approving Authority includes authority for all documents necessary to implement the authority, including ancillary agreements, on terms and conditions satisfactory to the Approving Authority, in consultation with the relevant operating Division(s).
- (w) Staff positions referred to in this delegation include successors from time to time.
- (x) Documents are to be in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor (including indemnity and insurance provisions).
- (y) Delegated signing authorities in B are conditional upon the documents having received the City Solicitor's prior "Approval as to Form".
- (2) Authority to use land acquired by the City for parking purposes by the Toronto Parking Authority is conditional upon Council enacting a by-law designating such use.
- (aa) All residential leasing documents shall adhere to the Residential Tenancies Act, 2006 and any successor legislation.
- (bb) Despite GC(n), Approving Authority in residential leasing matters is not limited to periods of less than twenty-one (21) years and total compensation in residential leasing matters where the City is landlord is to be calculated based on an assumed term of ten years unless the lease term expressly identified therein is longer.
- (cc) Where Approving Authority has been delegated to the Manager level, such authority shall be conditional upon the Manager first having secured the written concurrence of a second Manager within the Real Estate Services Division.
- (dd) Where the City is transacting with a public agency, and such agency requires that an unqualified environmental indemnity be granted by the City, the authority to acquire property includes authority to grant such an indemnity, provided that the Phase I and Phase II environmental site assessments undertaken on behalf of the City have identified no significant environmental impacts or human health threats, with no, or minor action required ("Low Risk").
