

The City of Toronto will resurface the road on Royal York Road from Summitcrest Drive to Lawrence Avenue West. The City will also reconstruct the road on Royal York Road from 100m North of Lawrence Avenue to Dixon Road.

Our inspection of the road shows that it needs reconstruction and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. This work is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Reconstruct the road on Royal York from Dixon Road to 100m North of Lawrence Ave West with new road base and new asphalt road surface
- Re-align maintenance holes and catch basins
- Repair curbs, gutters, driveways and sidewalk
- Resurface the road on Royal York from Lawrence Ave West to Summitcrest Drive
- Restore all areas affected by construction.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

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Construction Notice

	Work Hours: Work on Royal York Road will take place from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m, Monday to Friday; 7 a.m.to 9 p.m. on Saturdays; and 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Sundays
A	Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.
<u>aa aa</u> aa aa	This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Project Manager listed below.
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
8	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Some of these efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	Traffic on Royal York Road will be reduced to one lane in each direction to be shared by cyclists and motorists in the vicinity of the work
\mathbf{R}	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .
	In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Project Manager does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.
	TTC Service: This project may affect travel times on the 73CD Royal York Road bus. Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information.
