
The City of Toronto will replace the watermain on Dundas – Kipling Ramp from Dunbloor Road to Kipling Avenue.

The intersection of Bloor Street West and Kipling Avenue will be reconstructed and pedestrians will be unable to cross east/west.

• Travel west on Dundas Street W., south on Dunbloor Road, and west on Dundas Street West and north on Kipling Avenue


Motorists wishing to travel North on the Dundas - Kipling Ramp to Kipling Avenue from Bloor Street West, can:

Travel west on Bloor Street West, west on Dundas Street West and north on Kipling Avenue

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN WALKING

Pedestrians will not be able to cross Kipling Avenue at Bloor Street West. Alternative routes must be used, signage will be provided.



To walk on Kipling Avenue, if coming from north of the Dundas-Kipling ramp:

• Travel east on Dundas Street West, south on Michael Power Place, west on Resurrection Road, west on Bloor Street West, south on Dundas Street West to Kipling Avenue

To walk on Kipling Avenue, if coming from south of Dundas Street West, south of Bloor Street West:

 Travel east on Dundas Street West, east on Bloor Street West, north on Resurrection Road, north on Michael Power Place and west on Dundas Street West

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property.

1	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday with work after hours and on weekends as required.
3	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify of any temporary restrictions to driveway access. If a property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
Ė	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
Ī	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure bins are labeled with your address.</i>
