
The City of Toronto continues reconstructing the Six Points Interchange. There will be a full closure of vehicle access to the Dundas/Kipling Ramp from Tuesday August 6, 2019 at 7 a.m. to Friday August 16, 2019 at 5 p.m. for road reconstruction including full depth reconstruction of the ramp, pouring of a new road base, installation of curbs and paving. Pedestrian access will remain open along the north side of Dundas Street West.

<u>Dundas Street West, between Dunbloor Road and Kipling Avenue, will remain accessible to local traffic for the completion of road reconstruction until the end of 2019.</u>

The maps and information below provide information about the open and closed areas. Drivers, pedestrians and cyclists please be aware and obey the traffic movements, signs and signals.

 Travel west on Dundas Street West, south on Dunbloor Road, west on Dundas Street West and north on Kipling Avenue

Motorists wishing to travel North on Kipling Avenue from Bloor Street West, can:

• Travel west on Bloor Street West, west on Dundas Street West and north on Kipling Avenue

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

∱	Pedestrians: Please visit Toronto.ca/Etobicoke for updated pedestrian routes. Pedestrian access will be maintained along the north side of Dundas Street West. Pedestrians will not be able to cross Kipling Avenue at Bloor Street West. Alternative routes must be used, signage will be provided. To walk on Kipling Avenue, if coming from north of the Dundas-Kipling ramp: • Travel east on Dundas Street West, south on Michael Power Place, west on Resurrection Road, west on Bloor Street West, south on Dundas Street West to Kipling Avenue To walk on Kipling Avenue, if coming from south of Dundas Street West, south of Bloor Street West: • Travel east on Dundas Street West, east on Bloor Street West, north on Resurrection Road, north on Michael Power Place and west on Dundas Street West
څ	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify of any temporary restrictions to driveway access. Local access will be maintained during construction to businesses along the Dundas – Kipling Ramp
it.	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
T _o	Garbage & Recycling : Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure bins are labeled with your address.
(J)	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday with work after hours and on weekends as required.
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
WAY (B)	Transit: This project continues to affect travel times of a number of TTC and MiWay routes to and from Kipling Subway Station. Visit ttc.ca or mississauga.ca/portal/miway for schedule information.
OPEN	Village of Islington BIA and Local Businesses are open throughout construction. All are welcome to dine, shop and play! Local access will be maintained during construction to businesses along the Dundas – Kipling Ramp or please use alternate entrance to plaza along Renown Road
