Temporary Road Closure on Western Battery Road and Douro Street for New King - Liberty Bridge Hoisting


Bridge Opening: Spring 2020

Construction of the King-Liberty Bridge is well underway and the bridge piers are now in place.

This September, the steel bridge structure will be hoisted into position and installed. In order to bring the large steel truss into place, work will take place overnight and require temporary relocation of onstreet parking on some local streets, as shown below. Local access for vehicles will be permitted. Thank you for your patience during this work.

Following the bridge hoist work in September, the contractor will continue work to complete the bridge construction, with work to be completed and bridge commissioning taking place in the spring 2020.



WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

 You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

\bigcirc	Work Hours:
	September 13 – 16: Overnight and weekend work will take place as cranes and heavy equipment are prepared, the steel structure is hoisted in place and large machinery removed.
	The overnight work is taking place during a Metrolinx approved schedule to avoid impacts to train service into the City. When this work occurs there will be significant noise overnight and early hours in the morning to complete the bridge hoisting.
	Regular Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m, Monday to Friday
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

	 No access to and from King Street West No through traffic (local traffic only) from Shaw Street to Douro Street. Access to the underground parking at 1029 King Street West will be maintained at all times. 	
\mathbb{R}	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222 .	
	In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Project Manager does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.	
	Western Battery Road and Pirandello Street	
	 Permit Parking and on-street parking will not be available from September 3 to 5 and September 12 to 16 on Pirandello Street and Western Battery Road. 4J Permit Holders can park for free at the Municipal Carpark 224 (Green P) located at 34 Hanna Avenue during these times. 	
	Douro Street	
	• There will be additional on-street parking restrictions from September 9 to 16 on Douro Street.	
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>	
	Restoration: All impacted construction areas will be restored as part of project completion.
