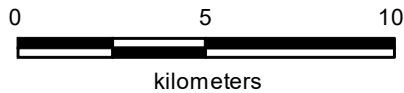
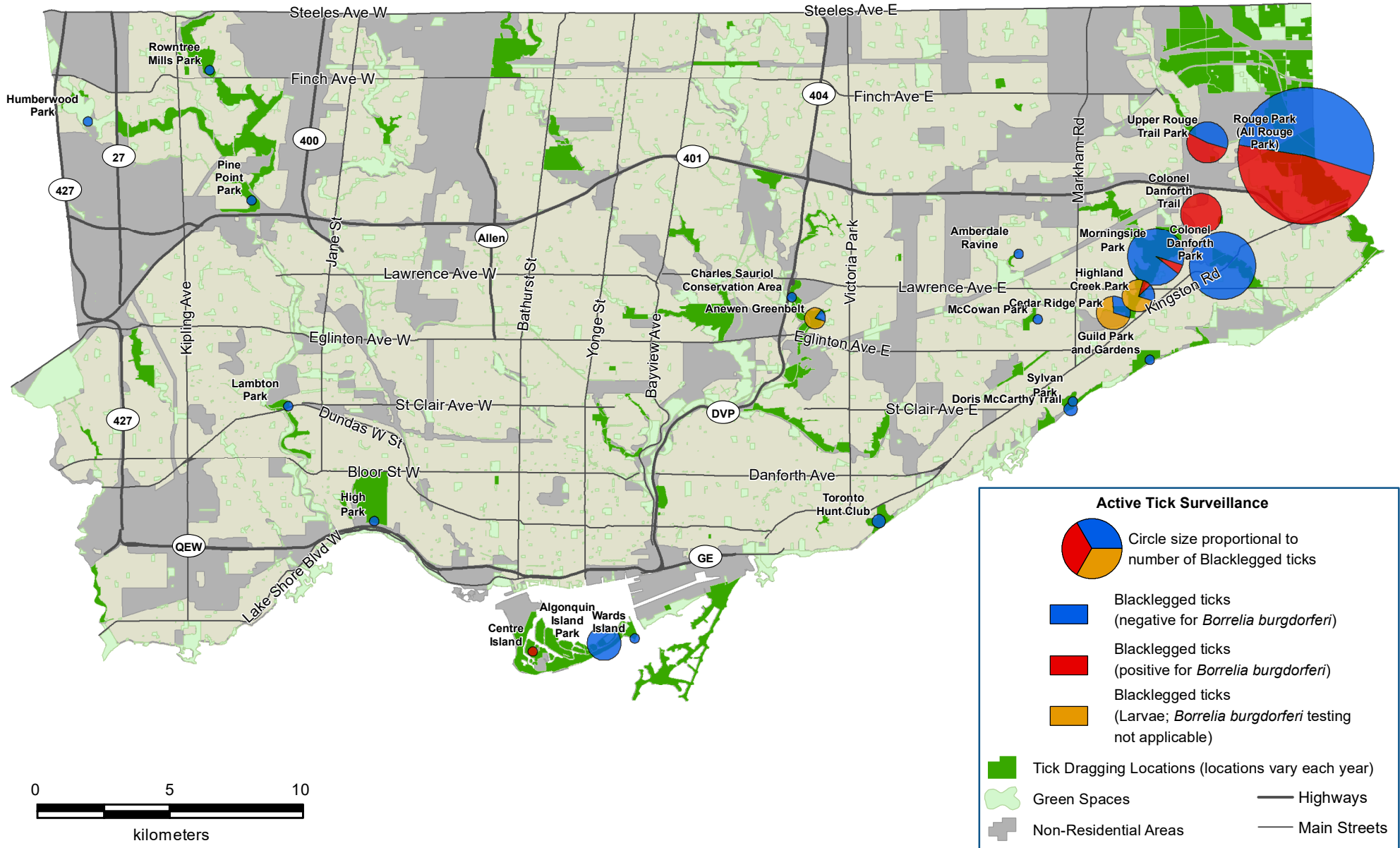


# Results of active blacklegged tick surveillance\*. Toronto, 2013 to 2019 data, combined.
