Donino Avenue Bridge Rehabilitation over West Don River

Contract: 19ECS-TI-16BE Expected Start Date: August 2019 Expected End Date: January 2020 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate the Donino Avenue Bridge over West Don River. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program. Donino Avenue will be closed at the bridge location. A signed detour will be in place as shown in the map below.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Repair the existing structure at road level and under the bridge
- Reconstruct the concrete bridge superstructure including the deck and sidewalk. parapet walls, railings and steel beam guiderails
- Relocate and replace the existing watermain, onto a new support structure on the east side of the bridge
- Improve the road drainage and bridge approaches
- Resurface the road on the bridge approaches

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

• You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

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Construction Notice

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
8 8 9 9	Pre-Construction Inspection: Properties will be inspected in the immediate vicinity of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The survey company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.
	Water Service Disruptions: From time-to-time, the water supply to properties near the bridge will be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not receive advanced notice, an <i>emergency water shut off</i> could have been necessary.
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe and efficient manner Donino Avenue will be closed to traffic and pedestrians at the bridge location.
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists and pedestrians will use: Donwoods Drive, Plymbridge Road, Plymbridge Crescent and Brookfield Road or Ivor Road or Donwoods Drive, Yonge Street and Mill Street to access the area north and south of the bridge (see map).
(\mathbb{R})	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. Please contact parking control for the location of your vehicle at 416-808-2222 .
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed during construction will be replaced.
	Water Flushing: You will see water flushing or running in several areas along this project enabling the contractor to clean the new watermain. Before the new watermain is put into service, the contractor ensures the new pipe meets Toronto Water's servicing and quality standards. <i>Please</i> DO NOT DRINK OR USE THE FLUSHING WATER, it is not potable.
