### Toledo Road Culvert Rehabilitation over Elmcrest Creek

Contract: 19ECS-TI-12BE Expected Start Date: July 2, 2019 Expected End Date: November 2019 \*Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate the Toledo Road concrete culvert over Elmcrest Creek. This culvert is located under Toledo Road between Arbroath Crescent and Renforth Drive. This work will ensure that the structure meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program.

The City's contractor will:

- Repair existing culvert and wingwalls;
- Replace existing steel railings;
- Repair concrete sidewalk and place new asphalt.

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## **Construction Notice**

8	<ul><li>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</li><li>Two lanes of traffic on Toledo Road will be maintained during the work. Short one-lane closures are needed for the delivery of materials/equipment, and during asphalt paving activities.</li></ul>
Ķ	<ul> <li>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area.</li> <li>Short closures of a single sidewalk at the culvert location will be required during the project. One sidewalk will always remain open.</li> <li>Access to Bloordale Middle School and nearby trails will not be impacted.</li> </ul>
$(\mathbb{R})$	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222. In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice. You may use this notice as part of your defence for parking consideration during construction; however, the Project Manager does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.
÷	<b>Driveway Access</b> : driveways close to the projects may be affected when sidewalks and roads are being paved. The contractor will contact those properties.
Ė	<b>Accommodation:</b> Residents who require accommodation should contact the project manager to arrange for access during construction.
	<b>Restoration:</b> Areas affected by construction will be restored.
