Dufferin Street Bridge Rehabilitation under the Beltline Trail

Contract: 19ECS-TI-11BE Expected Start Date: July 2019* Expected End Date: November 2019* *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate the Dufferin Street Bridge under Beltline Trail, between Roselawn Avenue and Hopewell Avenue, starting in July. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Clean and re-coat the existing steel superstructure and railings
- Repair the culverts and sidewalks beside the bridge
- Repair the concrete abutments
- Repair the concrete stairways at each end of the bridge

	-	edestrians access along the west side of Dufferin Street will be restricted seltline Trail. Pedestrians are advised to cross the road using the bridge.	
	Stage 3: Construction over the middle lanes. Both the east and west sidewalks will be accessible.		
	At all times during construction, a 1.5m pedestrian and cyclist corridor will be maintained on the Beltline Trail over Dufferin Street, and the access to the Dufferin stairways will remain open.		
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
