Ellesmere Road Culvert Rehabilitation over Massey Creek

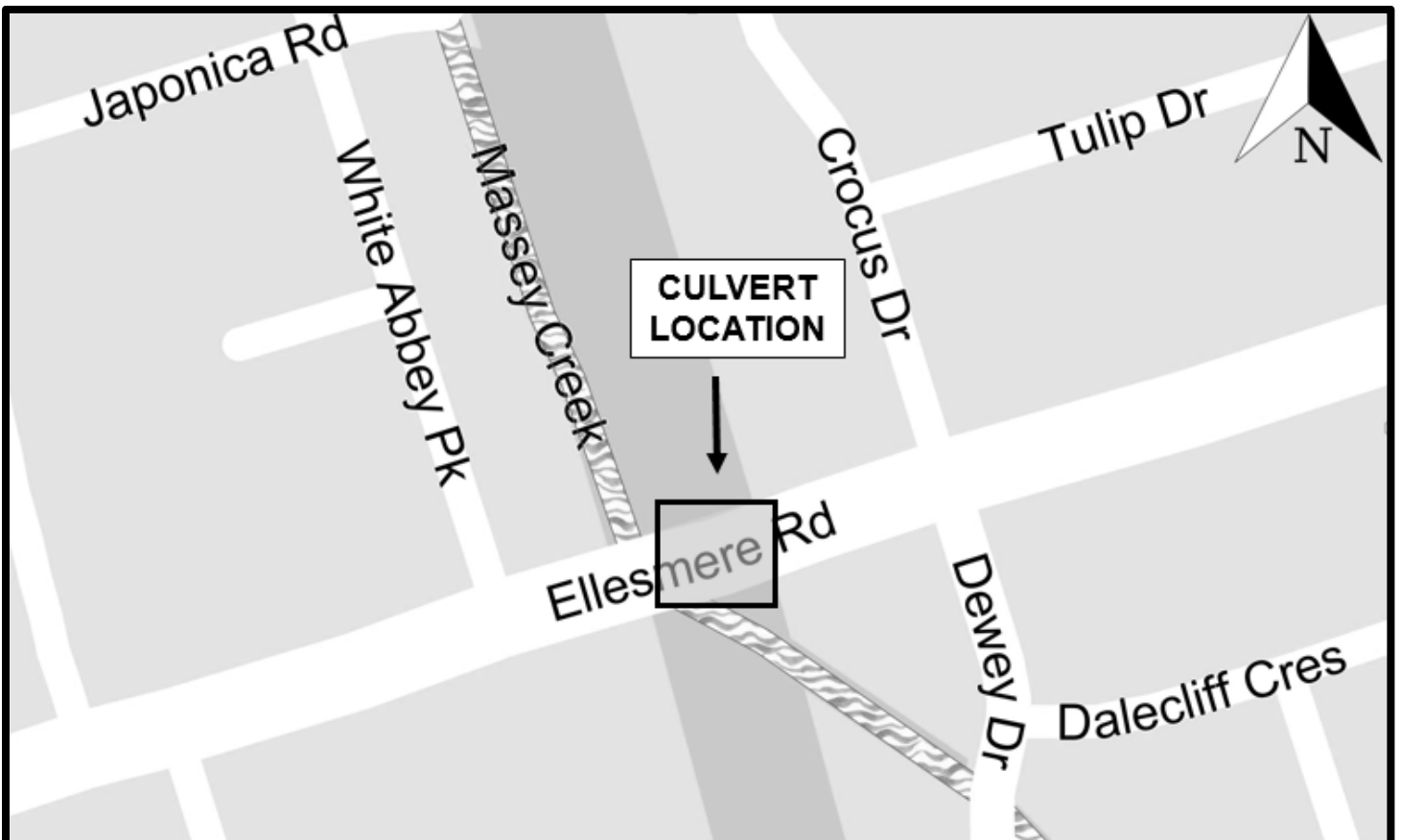
Expected Start Date: July 15, 2019

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate the Ellesmere Road culvert over Massey Creek. The culvert is located under Ellesmere Road between White Abbey Park and Crocus Drive. This work will ensure that the culvert meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program.

WORK DETAILS





The City's contractor will:

- Repair existing culvert;
- Replace existing parapet wall barriers
- Repair concrete sidewalk and resurface the road

Construction will take place in three stages:

Stage/Dates	Details	Work Hours
Stage 1 July 2019 to August 2019	Rehabilitation work will take place within the culvert under Ellesmere Road. Two eastbound lanes and one westbound lane on Ellesmere Road between Crosland Drive and Dewey Drive will be maintained during the work.	Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., with work after hours and on weekends as required.
Stage 2 August 2019 to September 2019	Rehabilitation work will take place within the culvert under Ellesmere Road. Two eastbound lanes and one westbound lane on Ellesmere Road between Crosland Drive and Dewey Drive will be maintained during the work.	
Stage 3 October 2019	Work will consist of road works in the middle of Ellesmere Road to facilitate rehabilitation work at the top of the culvert. One lane in each direction on Ellesmere Road between Crosland Drive and Dewey Drive will be maintained during the work.	

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	Work Hours: Monday to Friday: 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. The traffic management plan is shown in a table of this Construction Notice.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: Sidewalks on both sides of the road will be maintained during all stages of the work.
	Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored.
