The City of Toronto will resurface the road on Sherbourne Street from Bloor Street East to Carlton Street. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs resurfacing and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

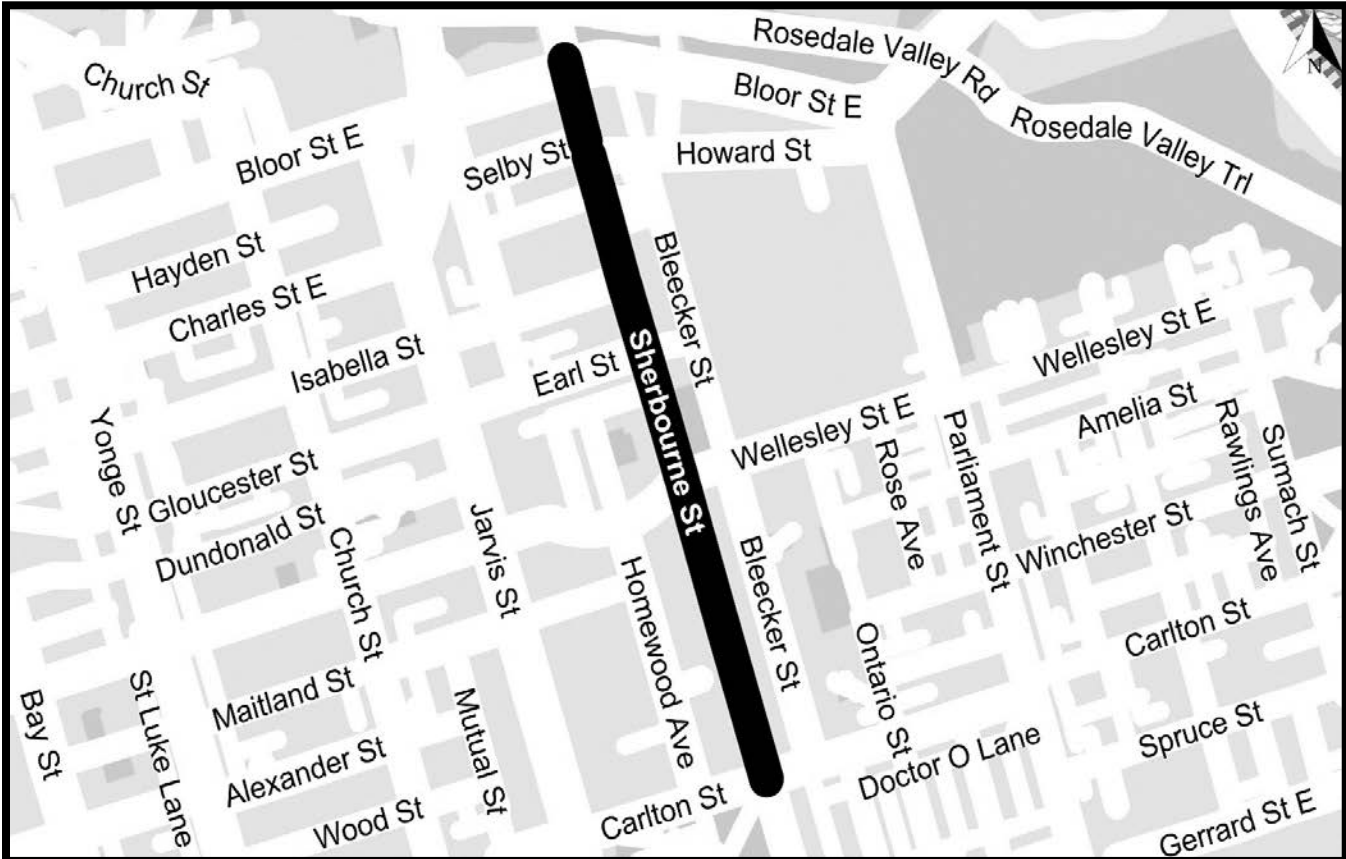
WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Some of these efforts include adding Local Access signs, revising traffic signal times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>Traffic on Sherbourne street will be reduced to one lane in each direction.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 am to 11:00 pm., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Pedestrian access to services and properties will be maintained via temporary bridges when sidewalk work is taking place.</p>
	<p>Cyclists: During construction the cycle track will be temporarily removed through the work zone. Signs for cyclists and drivers will be posted directing both road users to share the one lane of northbound and southbound traffic, single file through the work zone.</p>



Transit Service: This project will affect travel times or some stop locations on the 75 Sherbourne Bus. Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule.
