Preferred vaccine for 65+: Provide high-dose TIV vaccine for adults 65 years and older, without contraindications as it provides better protection against influenza A (H3N2), compared to standard dose QIV vaccine.

Avoid errors: Fluzone® (QIV), High-Dose Fluzone® (HD-TIV) and Afluria Tetra are different products in prefilled syringes. Ensure the appropriate vaccine is being provided to the patient according to their age group (i.e. HD-TIV is only for adults 65 years and older).

Nasal spray vaccine (FluMist® Quadrivalent) is not available in Canada for the 2019-2020 influenza season.

Vaccinating children: Children 6 months to less than 9 years of age receiving any seasonal influenza vaccine for the first time in their life should be given 2 doses of vaccine, with a minimum interval of 4 weeks between doses.



Flu Vaccine Delivery for Toronto Providers

Toronto providers can anticipate their auto-shipment of influenza vaccine from the Ontario Government Pharmaceutical and Medical Supply Service (OGPMSS) as listed below. Delivery will be on the facility's usual delivery day.

Early vaccine should only be given to persons who are high risk of complications or high risk to spread the infection (health care workers). Vaccines for the general public and those who are not at high risk can be provided after the launch in late October/early November.

The Ministry of Health has ordered additional doses of HD-TIV compared to last year's supply. More HD-TIV will be included in the first auto-shipments.

Vaccine Re-Ordering Process:

- All orders received before October 28th will not be processed.
- OGPMSS is unable to accommodate product-specific orders for quadrivalent vaccines.
