## **Purpose**

This grant supports partnerships with public school boards, hospitals, colleges, and universities that will increase canopy cover in Toronto through tree planting and stewardship on publicly-accessible green spaces on private land.

## Types of Projects Funded

All projects need to be focused on increasing canopy cover by:

- Planting non-invasive trees and shrubs on private land
- Maintaining and caring for existing trees on private land
- Educating and engaging the community in the planting, care and maintenance of trees on private land

# **Funding Amount**

You may apply for a grant from \$5,000 to \$100,000.

Grants must be matched 50-50 (\$1 for every \$1 received) in cash and/or in-kind contributions.

For funding requests of over \$50,000, you must contact Urban Forestry to discuss the project and eligibility beforehand.

### **Duration**

Grant funding is available for projects of up to 12 months in duration (to take place between January 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020).

For projects exceeding 12 months, you must contact Urban Forestry to discuss the project and eligibility beforehand.

# **Eligibility**

You must be a public school board, hospital, college, or university within the City of Toronto to be eligible to apply.

Previously funded groups who have failed to meet the terms and conditions of a past grant or who have any outstanding requirements may be ineligible.

Previously funded groups who have received over \$1 million in funding for related activities are ineligible to apply.

Only direct costs to run or deliver a project that are reasonable and necessary are eligible for funding. The following costs and/or projects are not eligible for funding:

- Projects that do not meet the 50% matching funding requirement (cash and/or inkind)
- Projects that are managed, delivered, or funded (fully or partially) by the City of Toronto
- Core operating funding
- Internal or external salaries or other people-costs where they make up more than 50% of the amount requested (including web design, graphics design, writers, translation, labour, etc.)
- Overhead and administrative costs where they make up more than 15% of the amount requested (does not include internal/external salaries or other peoplecosts)
- Fees and/or expenses for memberships, courses, conferences, travel, personal vehicles, and parking
- Taxes such as GST and HST for which the recipient is eligible for a tax rebate, and all other costs eligible for rebates
- Contingency costs
- Projects taking place outside the City of Toronto
- Capital costs or infrastructure not directly related to tree planting (building repairs or renovations, construction of sheds or garden beds, purchase of computers or audio/visual equipment etc.)
- Summer camps
- Land purchase
- Political activities
- Religious activities/services
- Advocacy expenses
- Research projects
- Fundraising activities
- Endowments or endowment building
- Scholarships, grants or bursaries
- Awards and prizes
- Alcohol purchase
- Tree planting on lands managed by the City of Toronto
- Purchase, care or maintenance of invasive species
- Any tree planting requirement or obligation under the City of Toronto's tree bylaws, as a condition for planning and development approval, or any other laws or regulations

# **Application Process**

There is a two-step application process. All grant applications must be submitted by email to: treeplantingstrategy@toronto.ca.

#### Stage 1: Expression of Interest (EOI)

- EOIs must be submitted by September 30, 2019 at 4 pm
- EOI submissions are reviewed for alignment with the grant guidelines and assessment criteria

#### Stage 2: Full Application

- EOI submissions that align most closely with the grant guidelines and assessment criteria will be invited to the Full Application stage
- Successful EOI applicants will be notified by October 7, 2019
- Full Applications must be submitted by October 21, 2019 at 4 pm.

## **Assessment Criteria**

Applications will be evaluated based on four areas: Concept, Feasibility, Budget, and Impact.

- The project must closely align with the stated purpose of the grant
- The application should clearly demonstrate the applicant's experience and capacity to successfully complete the project and to maintain the trees over the long term, and describe a feasible process to accomplish the project and has clearly defined project deliverables
- Project costs should be reasonable to achieve the proposed deliverables and the budget should clearly demonstrate how the 50% matching funding requirement (cash or in-kind) will be met or exceeded.
- The application should demonstrate the impact of the project as it relates to the purpose of the grant and in increasing tree canopy cover.

#### Additional assessment considerations include:

- Geographic representation across the City of Toronto
- Locations with low canopy cover or a high need for tree planting and/or stewardship
- Environmental impact of proposed activities (i.e. biodiversity)
- Community impact and benefit of proposed activities

## **Accommodation**

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

1. What do you consider as "private land"?

For the purposes of this grant call, private land is defined as land not owned or managed by the City of Toronto.

2. Can the grant be used towards tree removal or stumping costs?

No.

3. How are funding decisions made?

Applications are evaluated by a Grant Review Panel supported by staff from the Parks, Forestry & Recreation Division of the City of Toronto. The panel is made up of City of Toronto urban forestry staff, environmental leaders and experts.

4. Can I apply if I had previously received an Every Tree Counts Community Grant or Special Projects Grant for the same or similar project?

Yes.
