## Progress Avenue Bridge Repairs over McCowan Road

Contract: 19ECS-TI-14BE Expected Start Date: September 9, 2019 Expected End Date: November 6, 2019 \*Timeline is subject to change. Future notice to be provided.

The City of Toronto will be performing repairs on the Progress Avenue bridge over McCowan Road and install crash cushions. This work will ensure that road and pedestrian walkway meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program.

#### WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Replace barrier wall end treatments;
- Complete repairs on the pedestrian enclosure;
- Install steel beam guide rail at the W-N ramp from Progress Avenue onto McCowan Road; and
- Wash the pedestrian enclosure

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	<b>Work Hours</b> : Monday to Friday: 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., with work after hours and on weekends as required.
÷	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> Sidewalk access will be maintained on Progress Avenue during construction.
8	<b>Traffic Management</b> : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	<ul> <li>One westbound lane on Progress Avenue from Consilium Place to the McCowan off-ramp will be closed from September 11 until October 2;</li> <li>One eastbound lane on Progress Avenue from the Scarborough Town Centre entrance to Grangeway Avenue will be closed from October 9 to November 4;</li> </ul>

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	<ul> <li>The Progress Avenue W-N Ramp onto McCowan Road will be closed during one weekend (date TBD).</li> </ul>
	<b>Transit Service:</b> This project may affect TTC Transit travel routes that travel along Progress Avenue.

	<b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed during construction will be replaced.
