

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Queensway Sanitary Trunk Sewer (STS) located below Grand Avenue and near the railway corridor as shown in the map below.

The sanitary trunk sewer is an underground pipe that collects wastewater from various streets and conveys it to the Humber Wastewater Treatment Plant.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew the City's aging sewer infrastructure and will extend the service life of these trunk sewer sections by approximately 50 years.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Majority of the work is taking place in the City streets and beside the railway tracks. The Contractor will:

- Install temporary pumps and pipes to divert flow from the sewer so that it can be repaired from the inside.
- Reline the existing pipes using a trenchless method.
- A sock filled with resin will be inserted into the sewer pipe through maintenance holes and the sock is then cured with steam forming a new pipe inside the old sewer.
- Rehabilitate the maintenance holes.
- · Restore areas affected by construction.


WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable to ensure they are not affected by the work.
- You may experience dust, noise, trail closures, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.



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- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager / Field Ambassador listed below.
