Bloor Street West partial opening to motorists between Prennan Avenue and Dunbloor Road / Dundas Street West

Contract: 16ECS-TI-01SP

Partial Opening (vehicles only, one lane per direction): **Friday October 11, 2019 at 7 a.m.**

Complete Opening: December 2019

Timeline is subject to change

The City of Toronto is continuing Phase 3 of the Six Points Interchange Reconfiguration with the partial opening of Bloor Street West for motorists between Prennan Avenue to Dunbloor Road/Dundas Street West. Traffic can now travel continuously on Bloor Street West through Kipling Avenue without detours, and Kipling Avenue can be accessed from Bloor Street West in both directions.

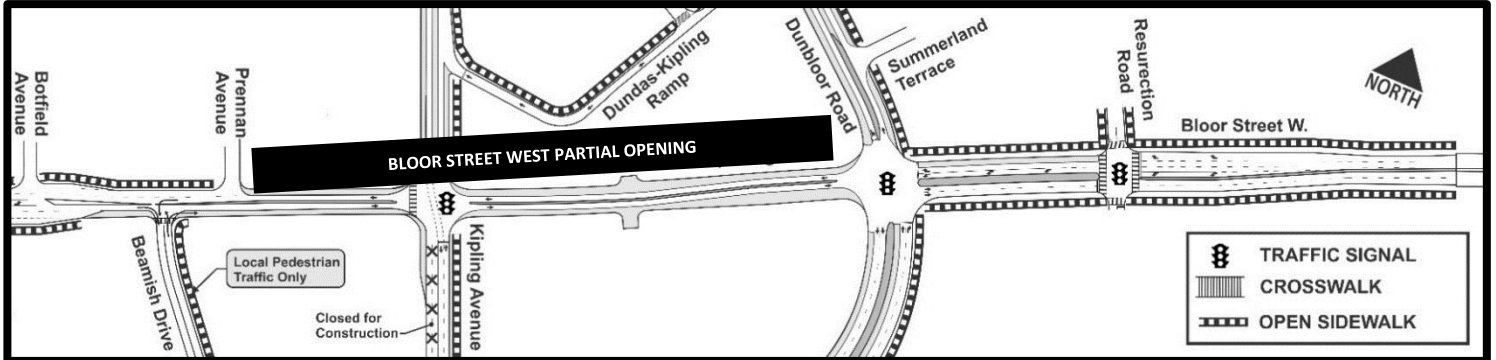
Sidewalks will remain closed on this portion of Bloor Street West and the pedestrian detour (see reverse) will remain effective until December 2019 when sidewalk construction is complete.

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN WALKING

Pedestrians will not be able to cross Kipling Avenue at Bloor Street West and are required to cross at the Dundas Street West and Kipling Avenue intersection, or at Mattice Avenue. For safety, this alternative route **MUST** be used, signage will be in place to help navigate.

Pedestrians wishing to cross Bloor Street West at Kipling Avenue, coming from north of the Dundas-Kipling ramp, east of Kipling Avenue:

- Travel south on Kipling Avenue and west on Dundas Street West. OR
- Travel north on Kipling Avenue, west on Mattice Avenue, South on Botfield Avenue

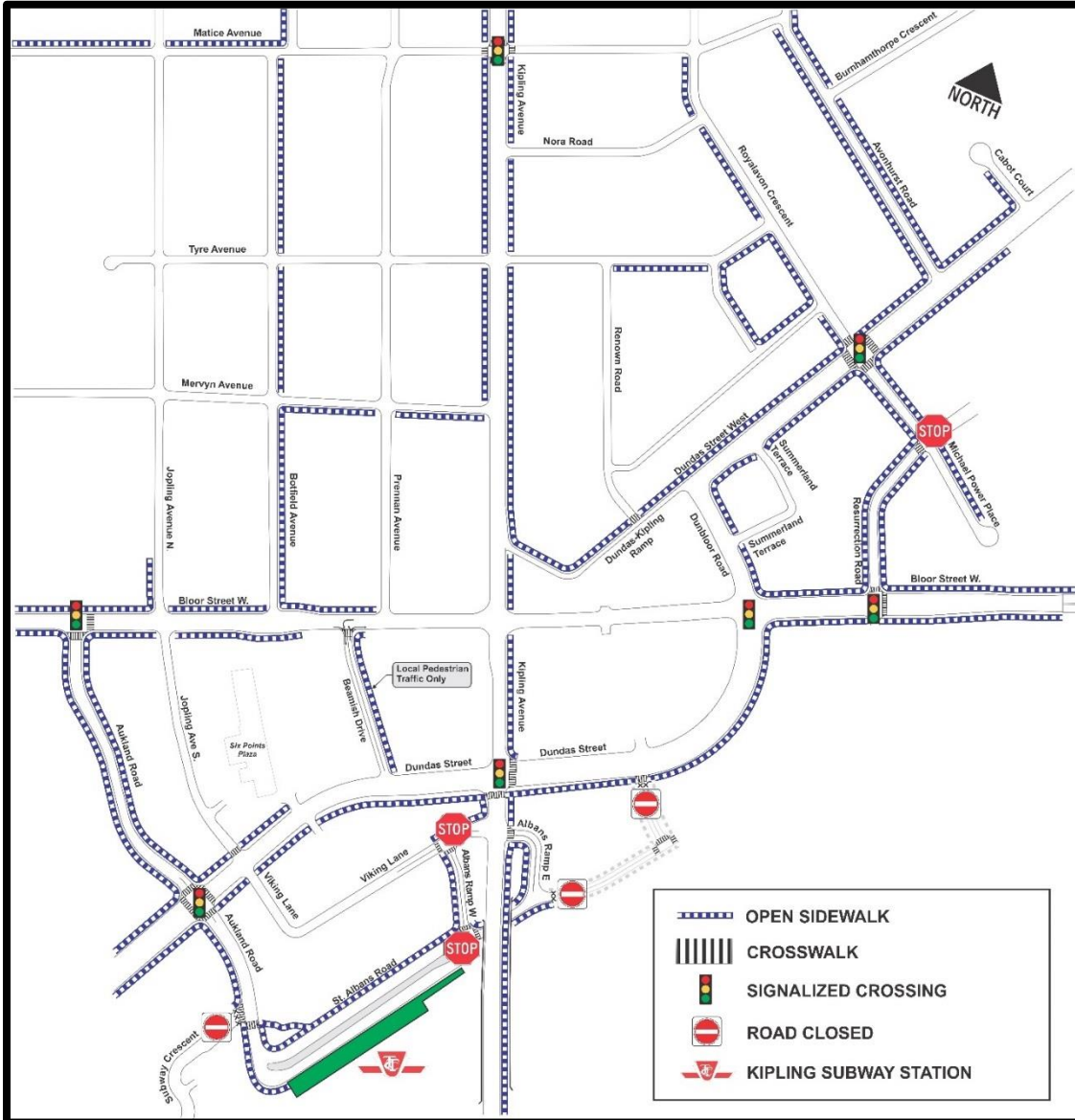
Pedestrians wishing to cross Bloor Street West at Kipling Avenue, coming from north of the Dundas-Kipling ramp, west of Kipling Avenue:

- Travel west on Bloor Street West, south on Auckland Road and east on Dundas Street West. OR
- Travel north on Kipling Avenue, east on Mattice Avenue, and South on Kipling Avenue

Pedestrians wishing to cross Bloor Street West at Kipling Avenue, if coming from south of Dundas Street West, and Bloor Street West:

Travel north on Kipling Avenue and west on Dundas Street West and north on Auckland Avenue.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday with work afterhours and on weekends as required.
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify of any temporary restrictions to driveway access.
	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
	Transit: This project continues to affect travel times of a number of TTC and MiWay routes to and from Kipling Subway Station. Visit ttc.ca or mississauga.ca/portal/miway for schedule information.
	Village of Islington BIA and Local Businesses are open throughout construction. All are welcome to dine, shop and play! Local access will be maintained during construction to businesses along the Dundas – Kipling Ramp or please use alternate entrance to plaza along Renown Road.
