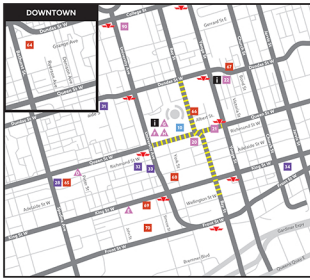

NUIT BLANCHE TORONTO 2019 CONTINUUM

GETTING AROUND

It's easy to access the event by foot, bike or transit.

All-Night TTC Service

In addition to the regular all-night Blue Night Network service, the TTC (Toronto Transit Commission) is extending all-night service to the subway from end-to-end on Line 1 Yonge-University, Line 2 Bloor-Danforth, and Line 3 Scarborough.

Day Pass/Group Day Passes purchased for use on October 5th will be valid until 7 am on October 6th.

- Line 1 Yonge-University service will operate all night from Vaughan Metropolitan Centre Station to Finch Station.
- Line 2 Bloor-Danforth service will operate all night from Kipling Station to Kennedy Station.
- Line 3 Scarborough service will operate all night from Kennedy Station to Midland Station.

Park & Ride

Free all-night parking is available at TTC Commuter Parking Lots.

Service Disruptions

The 501 Queen Streetcar will be diverted onto King Street between Spadina Avenue and Church Street and the 6 Bay Street Bus will be diverted to Yonge Street due to event road closures.

Free Shuttle

Service between Bloor/Yorkville (Royal Ontario Museum), Don Mills (Aga Khan Museum, Ontario Science Centre) and Danforth East (Neighbourhood Council) runs throughout the night. Capacity is limited.

ROAD CLOSURES

Four key road closures will provide more space for pedestrians:

- Queen St. W. between Yonge St. and University Ave.
- Bay St. East between Dundas St. W. and Wellington St. W.
- Fort York Blvd. between and between Larnach St. and Fleet St.
- Borough Dr. between Brian Hanson Way and Town Centre Court.
