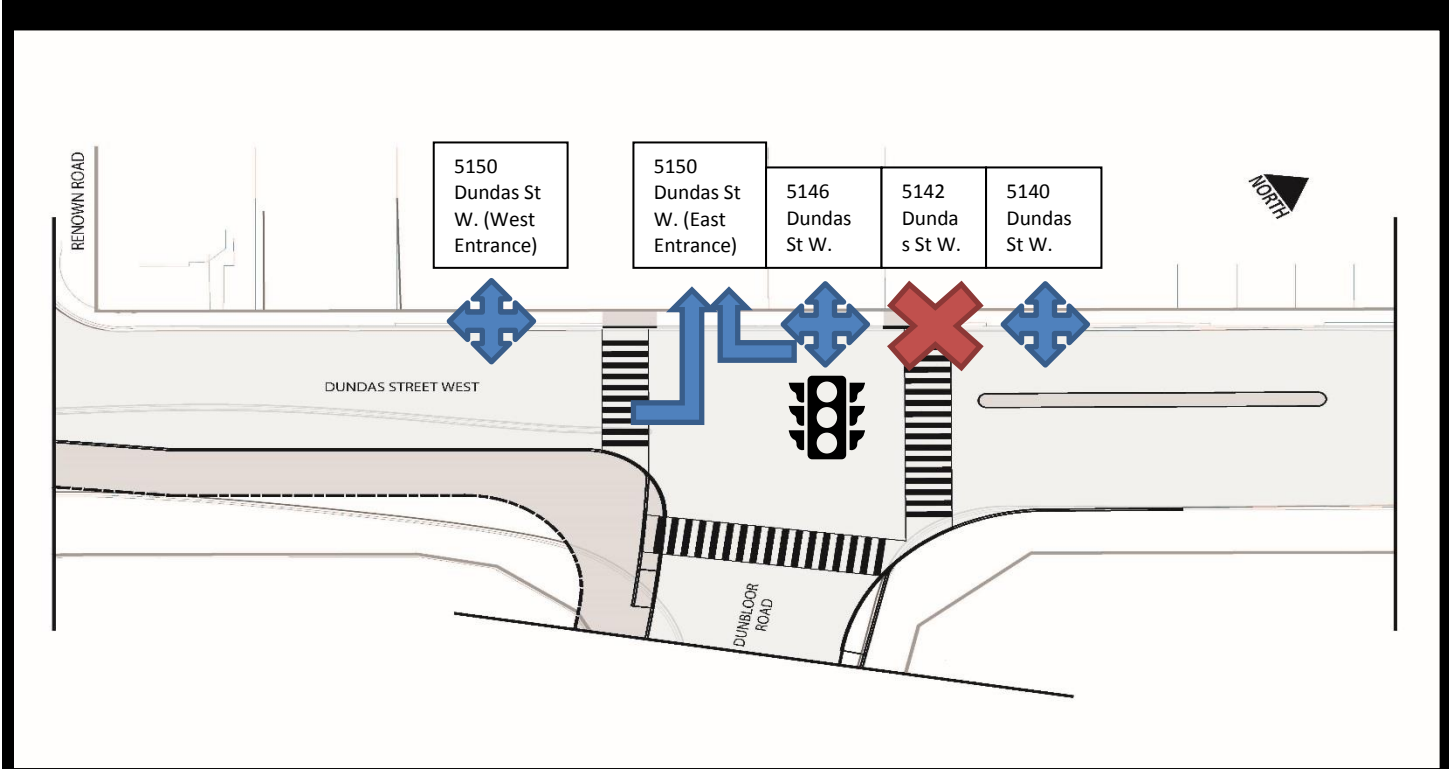
The City of Toronto continues reconstructing the Six Points Interchange. Work will be taking place at the Dunbloor Rd and Dundas Street West intersection, which will include changing driveway access to final configurations.

The new configuration will permit the following vehicle movements at the driveways described below:

- 5150 Dundas St W (West Entrance) - all movements permitted
- 5150 Dundas St W (East Entrance)- restricted to right turns and left turns in only
- 5146 Dundas St W - all movements permitted, operated by traffic signals
- 5142 Dundas St W - driveway closed
- 5140 Dundas St W - no changes

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property.

	Pedestrians: Please visit Toronto.ca/Etobicoke for updated pedestrian routes. Pedestrian access will be maintained along the north side of Dundas Street West.
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify of any temporary restrictions to driveway access. Access to all plazas and businesses will remain open during construction.
	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
	Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure bins are labeled with your address.
	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	Transit: This project continues to affect travel times of a number of TTC and MiWay routes to and from Kipling Subway Station. Visit ttc.ca or mississauga.ca/portal/miway for schedule information.
	Village of Islington BIA and Local Businesses are open throughout construction. All are welcome to dine, shop and play! Local access will be maintained during construction to businesses along the Dundas – Kipling Ramp or please use alternate entrance to plaza along Renown Road
