




# The Danforth Study consists of three components:








- 1) A complete street study: to examine the roadway width and curbside uses (i.e. parking and loading/unloading) and review options for a complete street design, and the potential for onstreet protected bike lanes between Broadview Ave and Victoria Park Ave.
- an understanding of the economic environment and issues faced by retailers along the Danforth between Broadview Ave and Victoria Park Ave.
- 2) An economic analysis: to provide 3) A planning study: to identify future city-building opportunities, guide new development, and enhance the public realm and quality of place between Broadview Ave and Coxwell Ave.

## What is a Complete Street?

They are streets that are designed to be safe for everyone: people who walk, bicycle, take transit, or drive, and people of all ages and abilities.






## Danforth Study Area

The planning study will be undertaken for the 3km between Broadview Avenue and Coxwell Avenue (Study Area A). The planning study has already been completed in the area from Coxwell to Victoria Park.

The complete street and economic development and retail study will be undertaken for the 6 km of Danforth Avenue between Broadview Avenue and Victoria Park (Study Area






# Activity Station #1: Community Charter





# Activity Station #3: Theme Priority Ranking


The Danforth study will cover a wide array of topics, including 8 study themes. We want to know what is most important to you as we begin this Study.

- 4) Please only complete this activity one time.
















# Activity Station #3: Theme Priority Ranking

## Theme Descriptions

#### Architecture & Buildings

Review existing built form and character to ensure that the design of buildings improve the community character.





### **Parking** & Loading

Assess parking and loading conditions to understand demand and available supply.



### Land Use & Development

Reviewing existing land uses and zoning, and identifying opportunities for accommodating growth, housing and development.





### Safety & Complete **Streets**

Reviewing Danforth Avenue and look to create a street that is designed to be safe for everyone: people who walk, bicycle, take transit, or drive, and people of all ages and abilities.



Assess and identify potential opportunities to enhance public spaces, streetscapes and the quality of the public realm.





#### Getting Around

Assess the movement of cars, transit, people, cyclists and pedestrians on Danforth Avenue and look to improve connections and access.



#### Community Services & **Facilities**

Reviewing the community services and facilities for the area to ensure that they meet future







### Heritage

Document heritage resources and preserve the heritage, historic and cultural resources in the area.



### Retail & Local **Business**

Review existing businesses. Support and promote the economic vitality of Danforth Avenue.
