Basement Flooding Protection Program Sanitary and Storm Sewer Upgrades, Watermain Replacement, and Road Work on Nash Drive, Gade Drive, other local roads, and Roding Park

Contract: 19ECS-LU-02FP
Start Date: February 2020 End Date: September 2021

The City of Toronto plans to modify and upgrade the storm and sanitary sewer system in your area in order to reduce surface basement flooding. This work also involves replacing the watermain and the City-owned portion of sanitary and storm sewer service laterals and substandard water services.

The sewer service laterals are the underground pipes connecting your home's plumbing to the City's sewer. The water service is the underground pipe that brings water to your property, via water meter. The sewer service and the water service laterals are owned jointly by you and by the City. The part you own is from your house to the end of your property (the property line) and the part the City owns is from the end of your property to the sewer or watermain.

Work will take place on Nash Drive, Gade Drive, Ianhall Road, Bunnell Crescent, Hallsport Crescent, Dorking Crescent, Roding Street, and in Roding Park (see map on page 2).

This project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve and renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that can cause sewer backups and flooding.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD WATER SERVICES



If you live on the streets in the map, in a house that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Please read the attached fact sheet with important information about the risks of lead in drinking water, especially if someone in your house is pregnant, there are children under six years old, or there is an infant drinking formula made using tap water.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

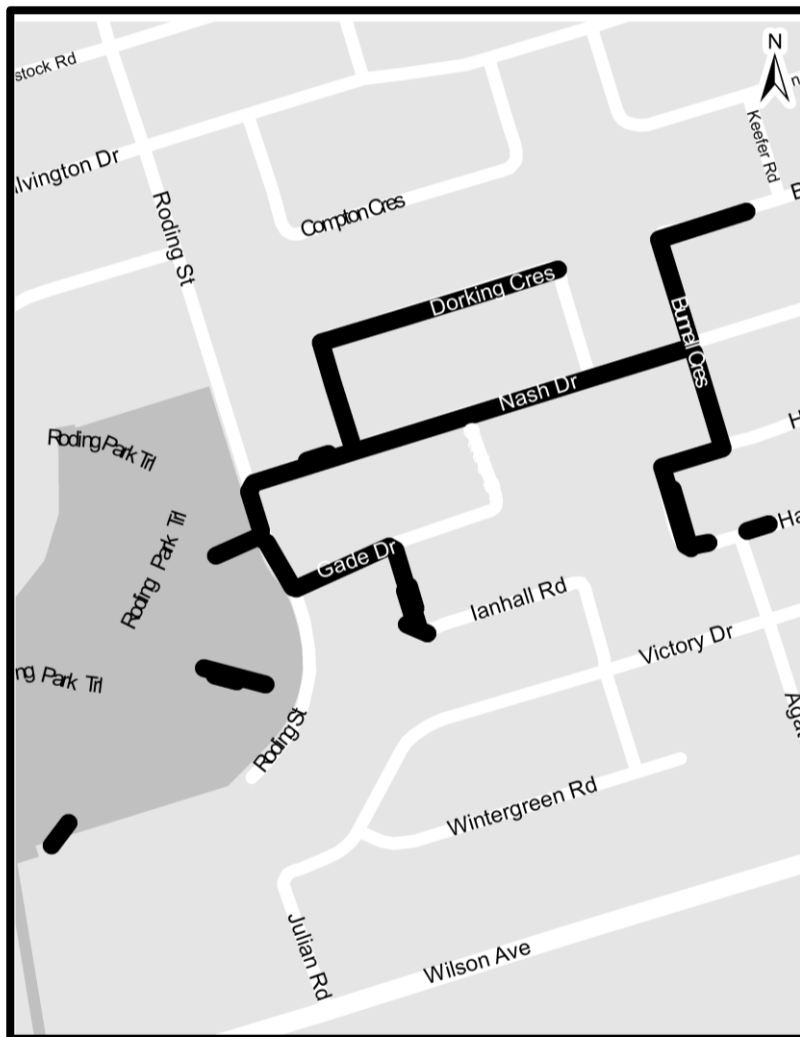
- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.

The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items that are located on City property, so please ensure that you remove/arrange for removal of each item prior to construction.

	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
	Access to Your Home: The City-hired contractor may need access to your home to complete a pre-construction survey. Affected properties will receive a pre-construction survey request to schedule a time to complete the survey.

	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems/heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. For details on removal of such items, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p>Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please take the time to read the attached fact sheet carefully as it contains important information on lead in drinking water and how to prepare for replacement. First, you need to find out if your water service is lead – a licensed plumber can help you with this. If the water service that you own is made of lead, the City of Toronto encourages you to replace it. We recommend you obtain several quotes and you can contact the City's contractor for one of your quotes. Approximately two weeks prior to construction, you will receive a "Construction Notice" with the name and phone number of the City contractor. Learn more at www.toronto.ca/leadpipes</p>
