Prepared By: Bruno lozzo Division: **Real Estate Services** Date Prepared: November 15, 2019 Phone No.: (416) 392-8151 Purpose To obtain authority to enter into an Expropriation Settlement Agreement (the "Settlement") between the City of Toronto and Ms. Terry-Lynn Margaret Weese (the "Former Owner") involving Unit #1 at 414 Dawes Road, as full and final settlement of any and all claims as a result of the expropriation of the aforementioned property (defined hereafter) to facilitate the construction of a new library and community facility on Dawes Road (the "New Dawes Facility"). Property The condominium unit municipally known as 414 Dawes Road – Unit 1, legally described as Part 1 on Expropriation Plan AT5120374 as displayed in Appendix "A" and on the Location Map in Appendix "B". 1. Authority be granted to enter into the Settlement, substantially on the terms and conditions contained within the Actions Confidential Attachment, including the payment of any applicable costs in accordance with the Expropriations Act. The Confidential Attachment to remain confidential until there has been a final determination of all property 2. transactions and claims for compensation relative to the New Dawes Facility and only released publicly thereafter in consultation with the City Solicitor. Funding for the Settlement, as set out in the Confidential Attachment, is available in the 2019-2028 Council Approved **Financial Impact** Capital Budget and Plan for the Toronto Public Library under capital project account CLB194-1. The Chief Financial Officer has reviewed this DAF and agrees with the financial impact information. On March 27 and 28, 2019, City Council adopted Item GL2.13 which authorized the expropriation of the Property to Comments enable the construction of the New Dawes Facility. The adoption of the Item also granted the necessary authority for the preparation, service and payment of Offers of Compensation pursuant to the Expropriation Act. Expropriation Plan AT5120374 was registered on April 25, 2019. The City took possession of the expropriated Property in October of 2019. The Former Owner was provided with additional time (delayed possession date) to ensure that they had sufficient time to relocate to their new dwelling. Ongoing negotiations with the Former Owner have resulted in a settlement agreement between both parties. A release of any and all claims for compensation under the Expropriations Act resulting from the expropriation has now been reached with the Former Owner. By proceeding with the Settlement, the City will forgo the remaining lengthy and uncertain expropriation process which will save additional funds that the City would have otherwise been required to pay as per the Expropriations Act. City staff consider the terms and conditions of the Settlement to be fair and reasonable and recommend approval. General Conditions ("GC")

(a)	The local Councillor (or local Councillors if the subject property is located on a ward boundary or if the transaction involves an exchange of properties in more than
	one ward), will be consulted prior to the exercise of delegated Approving Authority by staff for all Acquisitions, Disposals, Land Exchanges and Leases. In the
	event of a vacancy in the Ward in which the subject property is located, the Mayor's office shall be consulted in the alternative.

Where approving power has been delegated to staff, the Deputy City Manager, Corporate Services, in consultation with any other applicable Deputy City Manager (b) or the City Manager, may determine that such matter is of such special interest that same should be returned to the relevant Committee and Council for consideration and determination.

Exercise of delegated authority is subject to all applicable Council policies, statutes or other applicable law.

(d) Authority to approve financial commitments/expenditures is subject to all amounts being available in an approved budget, or funding being available from third party sources, except for "Strategic Property Acquisitions" as set out in EX44.22 adopted by Council August 25, 26, 27 and 28, 2014, which identifies alternative funding mechanisms subject to additional approval requirements.

Property interests are to be based on appraised value, and no interest shall be granted at less than market value unless otherwise specifically authorized. (e)

Authority to approve transactions at less than market value is subject to statutory anti-bonusing provisions. (f)

Total compensation means the aggregate of all types of payments, including land value, estimated clean-up costs, potential arbitration awards, loss claims, etc., (g) but exclusive of any applicable taxes and registration costs.

(h) Authority to acquire property is conditional upon provision being made to bring the property into compliance with applicable MOE or other requirements such that it will be fit for its intended municipal purpose, except for property acquisitions of 50M² or less for transit shelter purposes. Authority to initiate the permanent road closure process in **A.4** is conditional upon confirmation by the GM of Transportation Services that it is feasible to

(i) permanently close the highway.

(i) Disposal authorities in A.7 are subject to the property having been declared surplus, and the disposal policy complied with.

Land exchanges, except for those in A.8, may be authorized based on the delegated Approving Authority for disposals in A.7. (k)

(I) Approving Authority with respect to land located in the Designated Waterfront Area as defined in the Toronto Waterfront Revitalization Corporation Act, 2002 is conditional upon the approval of the Director, Waterfront Secretariat.

Authority to approve an exchange of land in A.8 is conditional upon confirmation by the Chief Planner and Executive Director of City Planning, and the GM of (m)

Parks, Forestry & Recreation, that the land being exchanged is (i) nearby land of equivalent or larger area, and (ii) of comparable or superior green space utility. (n) Approving Authority in A.9 Leases (City as Landlord) but not Licences (City as Licensor) is limited to periods (including options/renewals) of less than twenty-one (21) years, as leases of 21 years or more may be authorized based on the delegated Approving Authority for disposals in A.7.

Total compensation in leasing matters where the City is landlord (A.9) includes the value of tenant improvements if factored into tenant's rental payments. (0)

Total compensation in leasing matters where the City is the tenant (A.10) includes the value of any tenant improvements to be paid by the City. (p)

(q) Where options/renewals are included in leases, if the renewal rent is to be determined at a date later than the original approval date, total compensation is to be calculated as though all options are exercised, estimating the renewal rent based on the highest rent payable in the first term of the lease.

Total compensation in leasing matters where the City is landlord (A.9) or tenant (A.10) is to be calculated from the date of approval pursuant to this delegation (ie. (r) first allowing for the expiry of any prior approvals, whether by Council or a delegated authority).

Approving Authority in leasing matters includes authority to approve renewals/extensions within the parameters of the delegated Approving Authority. (s)

Approving Authority includes authority for amendments within the parameters of the delegated Approving Authority, the cumulative total of which may not exceed (t) the delegated financial limit.

(u) Where proposed additional amounts in A.13 exceed 10 per cent of the original decision, even if otherwise in compliance with all other conditions, then Approving Authority is transferred upwards to the next more senior level of Approving Authority having the relevant overall financial limit.

Approving Authority includes authority for all documents necessary to implement the authority, including ancillary agreements, on terms and conditions satisfactory (v) to the Approving Authority, in consultation with the relevant operating Division(s).

(w) Staff positions referred to in this delegation include successors from time to time.

Documents are to be in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor (including indemnity and insurance provisions). (x)

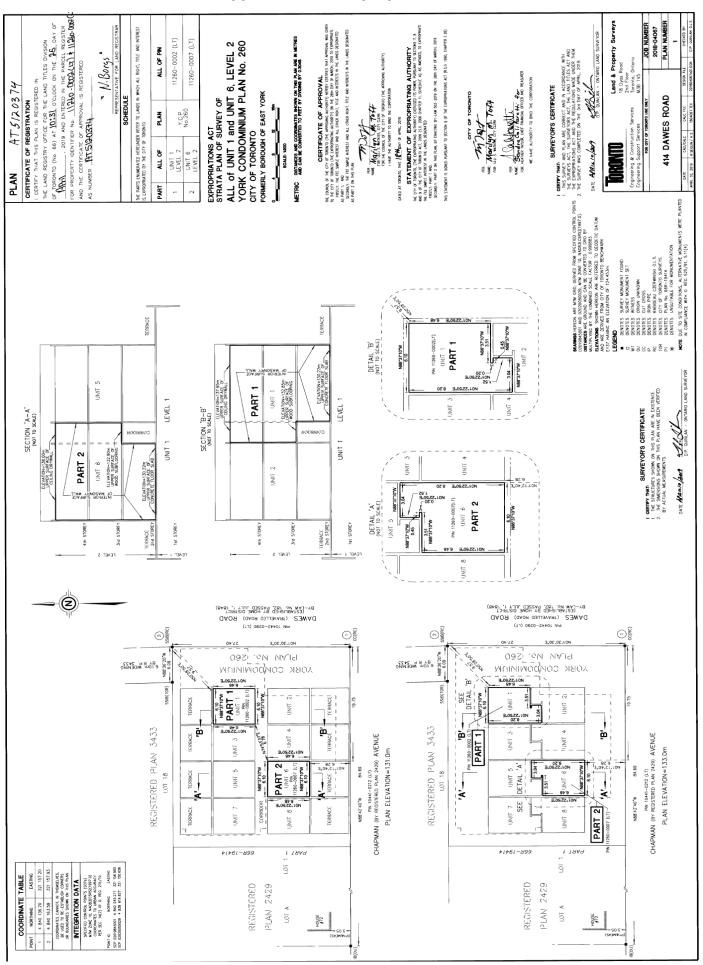
Delegated signing authorities in B are conditional upon the documents having received the City Solicitor's prior "Approval as to Form". (y)

Authority to use land acquired by the City for parking purposes by the Toronto Parking Authority is conditional upon Council enacting a by-law designating such (z) use.

All residential leasing documents shall adhere to the Residential Tenancies Act, 2006 and any successor legislation. (aa)

(bb) Despite GC(n), Approving Authority in residential leasing matters is not limited to periods of less than twenty-one (21) years and total compensation in residential leasing matters where the City is landlord is to be calculated based on an assumed term of ten years unless the lease term expressly identified therein is longer.

- Where Approving Authority has been delegated to the Manager level, such authority shall be conditional upon the Manager first having secured the written concurrence of a second Manager within the Real Estate Services Division.
- (dd) Where the City is transacting with a public agency, and such agency requires that an unqualified environmental indemnity be granted by the City, the authority to acquire property includes authority to grant such an indemnity, provided that the Phase I and Phase II environmental site assessments undertaken on behalf of the City have identified no significant environmental impacts or human health threats, with no, or minor action required ("Low Risk").
